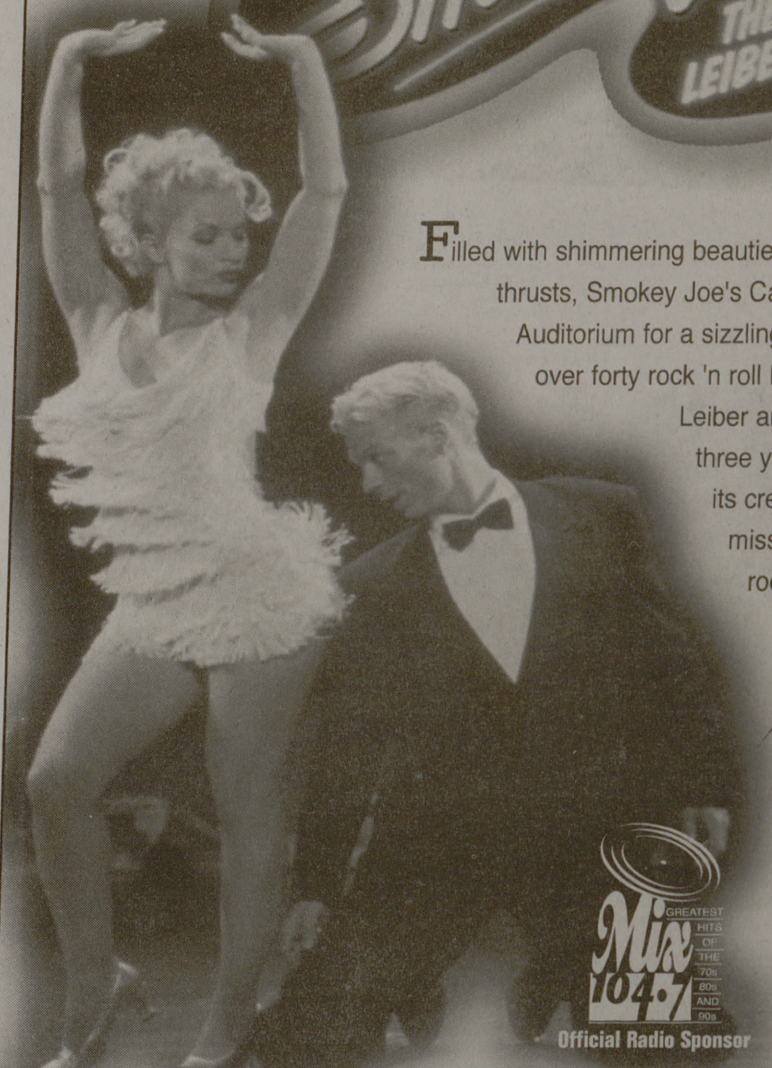


# Gettin' Shimmy Wit It

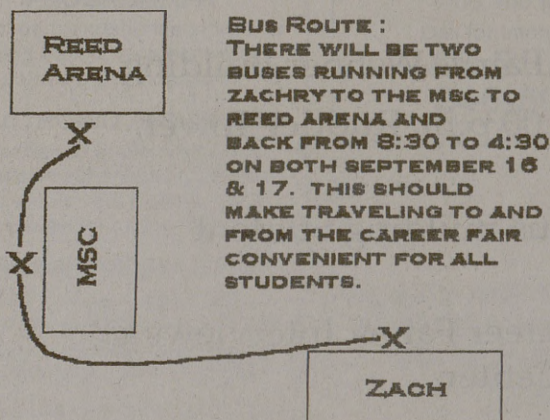

## Aggies stand 8-0 against 'Horns

The 10th-ranked Texas A&M Soccer Team went 3-0 last week to improve its overall record to 4-1.

The 'Horns twice last year, winning 4-1 and 3-1.

### Aggies receive awards

The Aggies cleaned up on awards at the tournament in Madison. A&M players took home both offensive and defensive Most Valuable Player honors from the tournament.

Sophomore forward Alison Peters was named Offensive MVP, scoring one goal and assisting on the winning goal in the first game against Wisconsin.

Peters added an assist in the game against ASU to give her four points for the tournament. Sophomore goalkeeper Melanie Wilson had 11 saves in two games and was named Defensive MVP of the tournament.

Senior defender Emily Elias was named to the All-Tournament Team as was sophomore midfielder Nicky Thrasher.

### Stats, rankings and more

The Aggies have outscored their opponents 17-3 this season and are averaging over three goals per game. The Aggies goals against average is a minuscule 0.6 per game.

Against Michigan, the Aggies set a school record with 21.5 blocks in a four-game match.

On the year, the Aggies are averaging 3.3 blocks a game. Junior Amber Woolsey and sophomore

Heather McWhirter are tied for the team lead in blocks with seven.

Woolsey leads the team with an average of 1.64 blocks per game and McWhirter is second on the team averaging 1.32.

The Aggies also have 387 digs for the year and they are averaging almost 17 per game. Sykora leads the team with 118 digs (5.36 a game) and Woolsey is second with 75.

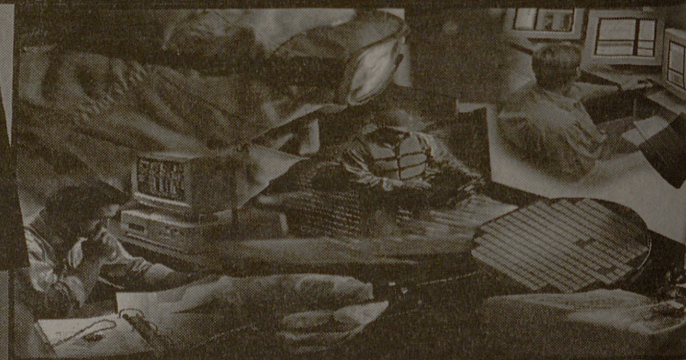
