Rounders is a story about Mike Mc-Dermott (Damon), a reformed gamoler, who returns to playing big-stakes oker to help his childhood friend Worm (Norton) pay off loan sharks. McDermott loses all of his money in high-stakes game at the beginning of the film and calls it quits to take the straight and narrow road of getting a real job to please his girlfriend Jo

(Gretchen Mol). McDermott's friend Worm comes into the picture, and McDermott becomes torn between sticking to this straight and narrow life, or going back to rounding to help his long-

ime friend. The film spends two hours examinng the world of professional poker players through the eyes of McDermott and depicts what it takes to make it

The acting in the film is excellent and is the film's driving force, but the lot is confusing during the poker

## **Buchwald runs** for the 'Apple'

NEW YORK (AP) - What's wrong with this picture? One of the biggest political stories in

history is unfolding in Washington, and Art Buchwald has moved to the Big Apple.

The Pulitzer Prize-winning political satirist and Washington institution has

washed his hands of the nation's capital.

He had to, he says, if he wanted to move on, personally and professionally.

"After a certain amount of time, there's nothing new. Restaurants are the same, stores are the same, your buddies are the same," Buchwald, 72, said in Tuesday's New York Times. "I do think one of the purposes of my move was to keep going."

Buchwald, who moved into the Regency Hotel last week, noted that his good friend Edward Bennett Williams, the lawyer, had died.

His friend Ben Bradlee, former editor of The Washington Post, is occupied with his fami-

And his column, syndicated in 350 newspapers, was moved off the front of the Post's Style section this spring.


