The communication between the two and the band's rhythm section (Nathan Hickman on bass and Brandon Elizondo on drums) is so seamless it's easy to understand why Steamroller is an Austin favorite.

The band has released two albums on its own Redwood Records label, *Steamroller* in 1995 and *Cabin Fever* in 1997. The latter reached #2 best-selling local album at Austin's Tower Records in less than one week, no small feat considering virtually all of its competition was backed by a major label.

Although Steamroller remains fiercely independent (the band is "effectively self-managed" according to its press kit), it seems the guys are doing remarkably well for themselves without the support of a label or any outside management.

Packwood marries aide

CLATSOP, Ore. (AP) — Bob Packwood and the aide who stood by him during the sex scandal that led to his resignation from office plan a walk down the aisle.

They will get married before the end of the year, Elaine Franklin said. "It's going to be at a very private location."

Franklin was Packwood's chief of staff until he gave up his Senate seat in 1995. The 66-year-old Republican was accused of unwanted sexual advances toward women.

Packwood, who is divorced, runs a lobbying business in Clatsop. Franklin does political consulting.

Travis performs award show

MEMPHIS, Tenn. (AP) — Garth Brooks will — and won't — be part of the Country Music Association's 35th annual award show Wednesday night.

Brooks, a megastar with the big black hair, will appear via satellite with Travis when they sing their duet "Where Your Road Leads" to a live audience in Buffalo, N.Y.

"Brooks has a very active touring schedule. In the fall, it's very difficult to get him," said Ed Benson, executive director of the CMA.

Brooks' share of country's royalty will be \$1 million. Shania Twain plans a big promotion for her single "Honey, I'm Home" with Alan Jackson, LeAnn Rimes, Patty Loveless, Reba McEntire, Tim McGraw, George Strait, Travis and Lorrie Morgan will perform.

Spacek reflects on Iowa residents

DES MOINES, Iowa (AP) — Sissy Spacek sees a little bit of Virginia in every Iowa resident.

Spacek is in town filming a David Lynch movie and said the locals are very friendly and pay much attention.

"It's refreshing to meet people who aren't completely swept away by the production," Spacek said. "It's a busy time here since this is harvest season, but still, people are very helpful, very friendly."

Spacek lives on a farm in the Ridge Mountains of Virginia. Her first impression of Iowans was that the airplane stuck on a runway was a result of mechanical problems.
