Hispanic Heritage Month continues with Caliente Festival celebration

The 1998 Caliente Festival, sponsored by the Hispanic Business Students' Association, was held Saturday in front of the Academic Plaza.

The festival featured booths from various Hispanic organizations throughout campus.

There was live entertainment throughout the event which included the Aggie Wranglers, the Aggie Dance team and a mariachi band. The event concluded with the presentation of the Mr. and Ms. Hispanic Heritage Month.

The winners of both pageants are chosen by their activities at A&M and in the Hispanic community, as well as their academic accomplishments.

The winner of Mr. Hispanic Heritage Month, sponsored by Kappa Delta Chi sorority, was Alexander Quiros, a graduate student in clinical psychology.

Quiros represented the Hispanic Graduate Students Association (HGSA). He has worked in the Bryan-College Station area offering marital counseling to Spanish-speaking couples. Quiros also has volunteered at the Women's Prison as a drug educator and as a probation officer in Bryan.

Quiros said he thought one of the most important things about the Caliente Festival is the sharing of cultures that goes on.

"This really helps bring together different groups and exposing different cultures," he said. "For example, I am Puerto Rican, but I get to share my knowledge and culture here, since it is predominantly Mexican-American."

The winner of Ms. Hispanic Heritage Month, sponsored by the Sigma Lambda Beta fraternity, went to Monica McArthur, who represented Ballet Folklori-

co Celestial. McArthur, a senior molecular biology and microbiology major, has worked as part of the St. Mary Aide Care team, been a mentor to elementary students and worked as a translator at the Bryan Health Clinic.

Both Quiros and McArthur were awarded \$200 scholarships for the spring semester. Yvette Urteaga, president of the Hispanic Presidents' Council, said the festival had a great turnout of approximately 200 to 300 attendees.
