

Clinton says he's strong for mistake

SAN ANTONIO (AP)—President Clinton said he paid a big price for his affair with Monica Lewinsky but that he is in regret is a cop-out. Clinton said his wife is "a real woman" and an inspiring moment of crisis.

"You don't have to worry me giving up," the president assured cheering supporters at a sweltering, outdoor event. "Don't worry," he said.

Ann Richards, the plain-spoken former governor of Texas, gave the beleaguered president a sympathetic introduction. "Bill Clinton isn't the first man I've had to forgive and he probably won't be the last," she declared, to a burst of applause.

Clinton, in his first since acknowledging the affair, said he should be stronger from the ordeal "gives me a chance to make their marriage whole."

"I think any time a person goes through a searing experience and comes out with truth and genuine change, that's an incredible erating experience," she said. "It makes you stronger."

The president's remarks in an interview with writer Tompkins were published in *The Washington Post* as Clinton arrived here at the end of a tiring, fundraising tour of Illinois, California and Texas. Looking tired, Clinton said he had nearly 1:30 a.m. Sunday, \$1.5 million, and then flew eight hours later.

Clinton was expected to raise \$1 million for Democrat Gov. George W. Bush. There were separate fundraisers in San Antonio and Houston. "I stand behind him," Clinton said.
