

soot has on respiratory systems. "Anybody who has a chimney needs to have it cleaned because it can be dangerous to leave it," Bruce said. "When you burn wood, the sap that is burned gets is very dangerous because creosote is flammable.

Bruce said there are dangers involved with the profession. that is it — you are going to fall," she said. "Some people it can get hot. But, it can be a beautiful sight.

Elderidge said chimney sweeps have a big advantage over other professions.
