



"The total cost of the actual building was \$4.9 million and the equipment and software cost \$1.4 million," he said.

Putnam said all the money that has been invested in the computing center has come directly from the students. The money was collected by adding a \$1 per-credithour charge to every student's Computer Access Fee.

The main point that needs to be acknowledged is that this computing center was initiated by students, paid for by students, and is operated by students, so a big part of the dedication is recognizing students' efforts," Putnam said.




