Taylor honored for OSU performance Tickets available for women's game

DALLAS (AP) — Kansas State quarterback Michael Bishop, Oklahoma cornerback Corey Ivy and Texas A&M kick returner-receiver Chris Taylor have been named the Big 12's players of the week.

Bishop completed 16 of 26 passes for 225 yards and a touchdown and rushed 13 times for 95 yards and two touchdowns in the Wildcats' 54-6 victory over Kansas. Bishop moved into a tie for second place on the school's all-time touchdown passes list with 29.

Ivy killed two Iowa State drives with interceptions in the end zone and was credited with four tackles (two unassisted) and a pass deflection as Oklahoma limited the Cyclones to 288 yards of offense in a 17-14 victory.

Taylor set up one touchdown with an 84-yard kickoff return and caught a 34-yard touchdown pass with 12:15 left in the third quarter to help the Aggies beat Oklahoma State 17-6.

Fans who purchased season tickets for the 1998-1999 Texas A&M Women's Basketball Team can pick them up beginning today at 7 a.m. in room 132 of G. Rollie White Coliseum.

UK players suspended for 4 games

LEXINGTON, Ky. (AP) — Three University of Kentucky players will sit out the Wildcats' first four games, including two regular-season games, under suspensions announced Monday by coach Tubby Smith.

The suspension of forward Myron Anthony, guard Ryan Hogan and center Jamaal Magloire had been expected since June, when Smith said all three would be punished for misdeeds off the court. Smith waited until the day before the Wildcats' exhibition opener to announce the details.

"I'm not surprised," said Hogan, who pleaded guilty to driving under the influence in May. "It's what I expected. ... I wanted to get it over with, move on and look forward to getting on with the season."

All the games to be missed are at home: Tuesday against California All-Stars, Nov. 11 against the Australian All-Stars, Nov. 17 against Eastern Kentucky, and Nov. 19 against Mercer.
