Scoring is based on an equation of 25 percent physical training, 25 percent academic and 50 percent leadership abilities.



'This is a very prestigious award in the fact that there were probably close to 250 people that he was competing against," Daniels said. "He not only finished number one in his company, but he had the highest average out of the battalion which is close to 700 individuals from around the country.

Hazen said more people are aware of the environmental benefits than of the economic impact of recycling.

Katie Fritz, recycling coordinator for the city of College Station, said the phone book recycling campaign is the primary event of the community. Fritz said TNRCC has collected more phone books from the community than it had at the same time last year, and her goal is to see 40 tons of phone books recycled this year.

Fritz said there are drop-off places located throughout the community, including elementary schools, Super Wal-Mart in Bryan, Bryan and College Station City Hall buildings and the Texas A&M campus.

She said the campaign encourages people to recycle throughout the entire year, not only on designated days.

Fritz said people do not realize how much of an impact each person who recycles makes.

"Just doing one thing all year-round helps," she said. "If everyone just did their part, it all adds up.'
