Hazen said more people are aware of the en-
vironmental benefits than of the economic im-
pact of recycling.
"I think one of the things people miss is the
economic impact on Texas," he said. "The pro-
cessing and manufacturing of those recyclables is responsible for 20,000 jobs, and it adds 28
million dollalas] to the state economy."
Katie Fritz, recycling coordinator for the city
of College Station, said. the phone book recy-
cling campaign is the primary event of the com-
munity. Fritz said TNRCC has collected more
phone books from the community than it had
at the same time last year, and her goal is to see
40 tons of phone books recycled this year.
Fritz said there are drop-off places located
throughout the community, including elemen-
tary schools, Super Walal-Mart in Bryan, Bryan
and College Station City Hall buildings and the
Texas A\&M campus.
She said the campaign encourages people to
reccycle throughout the entire year, not only on
designated days.
Fritz said people do not realize how much of
an impact each person who recycles makes.
"Just doing one thing all year--round helps."
she said. "If everyone just did their part, it all
adds up."
