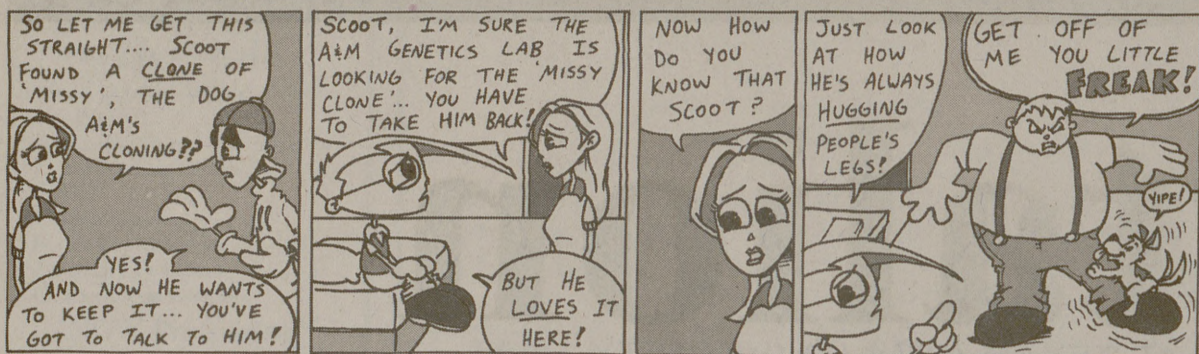

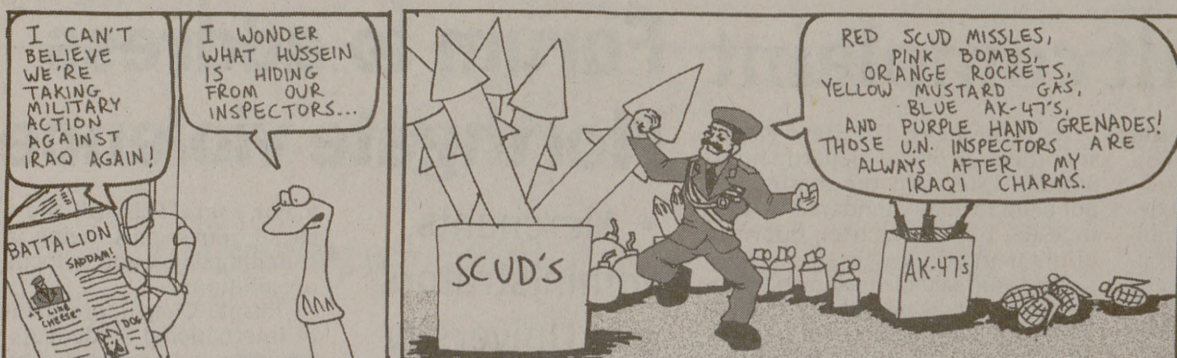

Narolla brought the issue of Northgate to the attention of community members two weeks ago when he met with College Station officials. He said one of the major differences he sees in dealing with Northgate is the number of student and community organizations that are involved. He said leaders of the Student Government Association and Graduate Student Council have worked hard to deal with the problem. Ohashi said the forum will close by encouraging those in attendance to join one of the three committees the solutions have been divided into. If the allegations are presented to SCRS, Patterson said they will interview both parties, and collect information and potential witness testimony about the possible violation of University Student Rules.

Patterson said if the matter goes to a hearing, hearing officers will be from the Department of Student Life as well as the Corps of Cadets.

Patterson said, if after a hearing, it is determined the sophomore violated University Student Rules, he could face possible disciplinary sanctions ranging from a reprimand to expulsion from the University.

Correspondence between the victim and the Brazos Valley Rape Crisis Center remains confidential and the files are deleted when a victim stops correspondence.

Cybercom Internet Services of College Station designed the Website through a program that embeds the information in the Web site. The victim selects a name and password for counseling with the center and all communications are embedded in the home page. The victim can retrieve the information from the Brazos Valley Rape Crisis Center using

the alias name and password, similar to the embedding program used by credit-card companies.

Hostetter said increasing access to computers and to the Internet may lead to an increase in online counseling services.

"As far as we know, we are the only rape crisis center that provides counseling online that is free, anonymous and confidential," Hostetter said.

Hostetter said an estimated 90 percent of women who are raped never report the crime, never consult a physician and never seek counseling.

"The (online) service is vital to helping a client," Hostetter said.

"Confidentiality is an issue. In the state of Texas, we are trying to get the legislature to recognize information as protected information, like attorney-client privilege. In addition to online counseling, Brazos Valley Rape Crisis Center offers a 24-hour hotline, a 24-hour escort service to hospitals, police departments and court, and a separate counseling center for teen-age victims.
