Will he run?

Gov. Bush says family reluctant to him entering presidential race

HOUSTON (AP) — Gov. George W. Bush, fending off persistent questions about a possible presidential run for president, said yesterday he wanted to soak in this week's inaugural hoopla that four years ago was just an emotional blur.

"This time I hope to be able to observe it," Bush said after speaking to a Martin Luther King Jr. Day celebration in Houston that kicked off two days of inaugural activities.

"Last time I was so emotional I didn't pay much attention to what was going on."

Bush, beginning his second four-year term as Texas governor, declined to preview today's inaugural speech.

"I shouldn't put it out too early, otherwise you won't listen to it," he laughed.

"This is going to talk about how I see the 21st century in Texas, what challenges we face and make sure everybody participates."

Bush reiterated that no decision had been made about a possible White House run in 2000.

But he acknowledged that his wife, Laura, was resisting and his twin 17-year-old daughters

were not enthusiastic.

He also said if the three all were against it, he would still consider running.

"I think my family will support me whatever decision I make," Bush said.

"If I choose to seek the presidency, they'll be for me. If I choose not to seek the presidency, they'll understand why. I think they're going to love me either way."

Bush described his wife as not pushing for the family to be put through "the meat grinder of national politics."

As for his daughters, the governor said: "I haven't met any 17-year-old child that's anxious to be drug through the national spotlight."

"You bet our teen-age daughters are reluctant. I would have been the same way at age 17."

Laura Bush, standing behind her husband as he was peppered with questions from reporters, would not get drawn into the debate and insisted she only was looking forward to the inauguration.

"It's a huge decision, as everyone knows, and we haven't made it yet," she said of a presidential run. "Right now we're focusing on Texas."

After the Houston appearance, Bush, also accompanied by Lt. Gov.-elect Rick Perry, re-

turned to Austin for the noon of children's day at the Capitol grounds, following an 81-unit parade in the city and four inaugural balls.

Organizers who had some \$1.5 million in expenses are expected to have a busy day's festivities.

In Houston yesterday, Perry said he disagreed with the traditional view that Martin Luther King Day was an event to be marked by Americans.

"I think all Texans should celebrate Dr. King and his message," Bush said. "It's important to contemporary judging people for who they are, not lumping people into groups, but giving each individual a chance to exercise heart and soul and conscience."

"The idea of serving your neighbor in need is a powerful message."

"Government can't do it alone," Perry said, who will become the first Republican to take the oath of office as Texas governor. "It's up to us to get involved."
