using the world wide web for research

Texas A&M University General Libraries is offering a class to assist Texas A&M University students and faculty in effectively using the World Wide Web for research.

This session uses Netscape Navigator to search the World Wide Web. It surveys WWW search services, illustrates advanced search strategies, teaches how to store sites useful for your class work or research and provides criteria for evaluating and citing web information. Sessions include demonstration and hands-on practice.

PREREQUISITE: This class meets for an hour and 15 minutes in a CIS Open Access Computing Lab. You must CLAIM A LABS ACCOUNT from the Block ATM screen or a CIS help desk (call 845-8300 for assistance) prior to the class in order to use a computer in an Open Access Computing Center.

Meeting to discuss increasing tuition

COLLEGE STATION - Texas A&M University President Ray M Bowen has scheduled an open forum for Tuesday, Jan. 26, for students, faculty, staff and the public to discuss a proposed increase in the University Authorized Tuition (UAT) for the 1999 fall semester.

Bowen plans to explain why a fee increase is warranted and to seek input on that increase during the forum which is scheduled 3 to 5 p.m. in the Memorial Center Room 292.

After skipping one year, an increase in FY99, university administrators are suggesting a decrease of \$4 per semester hour beginning with the 1999 semester. This would be emphasized in a news release early 1998.

The increase, if approved by the Board of Regents of the Texas University System, will bring UAT to \$38 per credit hour, the amount allowed by the Texas Legislature. This will amount to a decrease of approximately \$50 per semester in UAT by Texas A&M students.

The proposed increase will provide an additional \$4.4 million to the University, funds Bowen said will help Texas A&M maintain its margin of excellence.

The hearing was recently authorized by the chancellor of the A&M University System.
