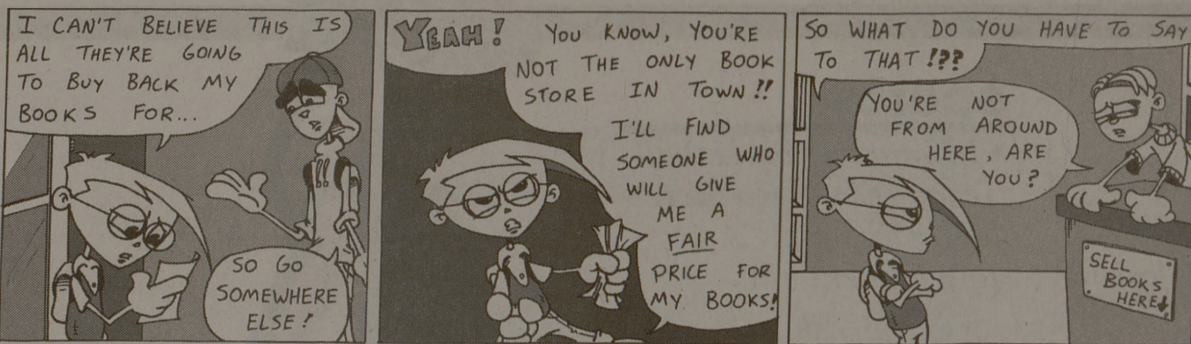

"They received an avalanche of opposition from anti-choice groups who made life miserable for them," she said.

"The chamber got drawn into an issues discussion that they didn't have to accept, instead of looking at it as a business in the community."

"We bear no ill will towards the chamber and hope to continue to play a part in the life of the community, Nenny said.

"We would like to do that as a member of the chamber."

Dyann Santos, director of the new clinic, said Planned Parenthood decided to open the

clinic because of a need for it in the community.

"This area is underserved as far as that service," she said.

"This is part of our commitment to reproductive health care and women's issues, so women have access to this service."

"We've done tracking numerous times, and we get 100 calls a month requesting information on abortion services," she said.

Santos said a percentage of women receiving services from the Waco and Houston clinics come from the Bryan-College Station area.

Out of the 10 Planned Parenthood clinics in southeast Texas, the only other one that

offers abortion services is the Fannin clinic in Houston.

The chamber will have both Hope Pregnancy and Planned Parenthood fore voting on the issue stating membership.

In order for the approved, there must be a third vote in favor of the chamber rules requiring a quorum of 14 members and attendance to vote on the issue.

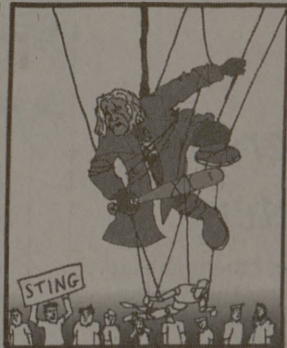
Donohue said in the time, BVCL will continue to hold prayer vigils, and events to reach the community.

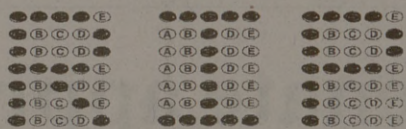
