The Truman Show one of the most talked about movies of the year depicts the life and times of Truman Burbank from hia birth to his grand exit.


Jim Carrey plays Truman in this funny, sophisticated and thought-provoking drama.

Gross-out comedies seemed to be


a trend in 1998. Many movies tried to compete with *There's Something About Mary*, but somehow couldn't close.
