ver Spurs of Aggielanders will entertain House.

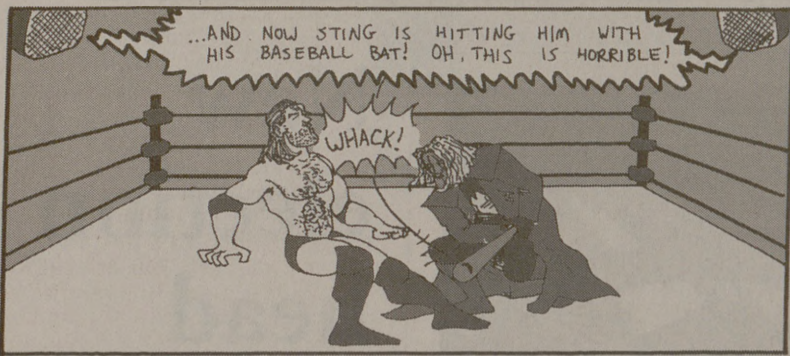
