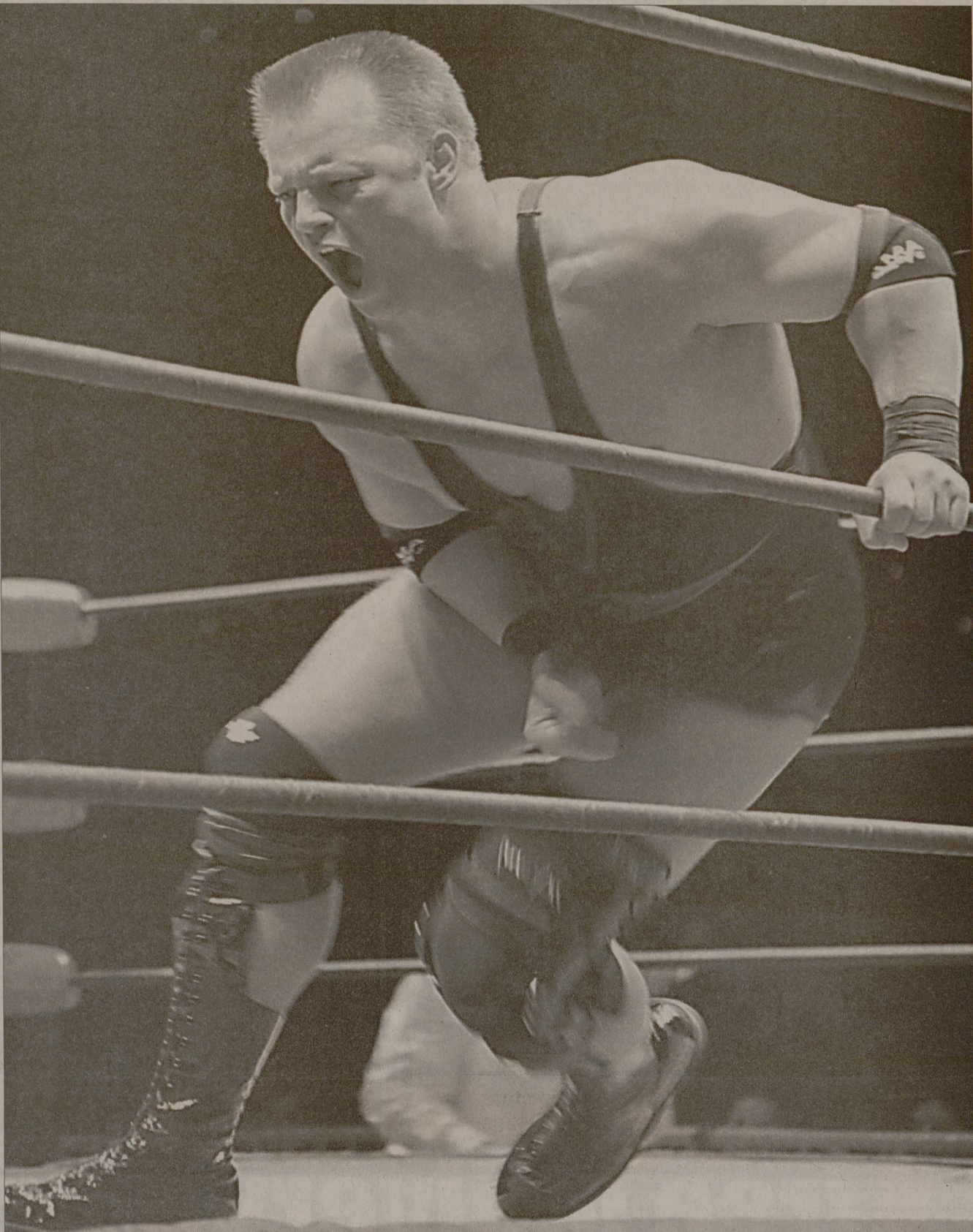

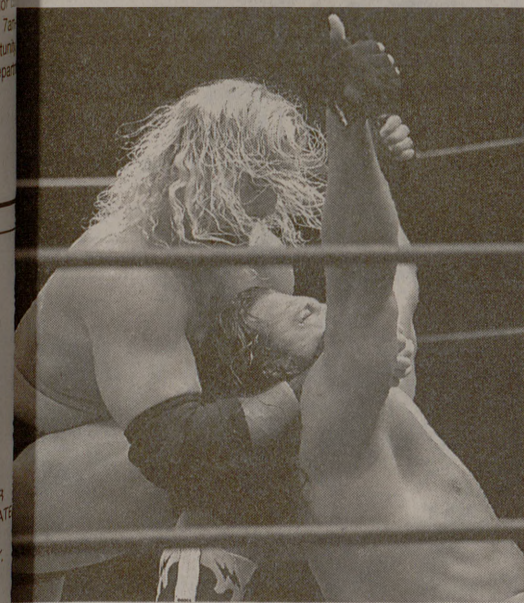

Glacier takes a blow from Chris Adams during the first match at Reed Arena Sunday night.

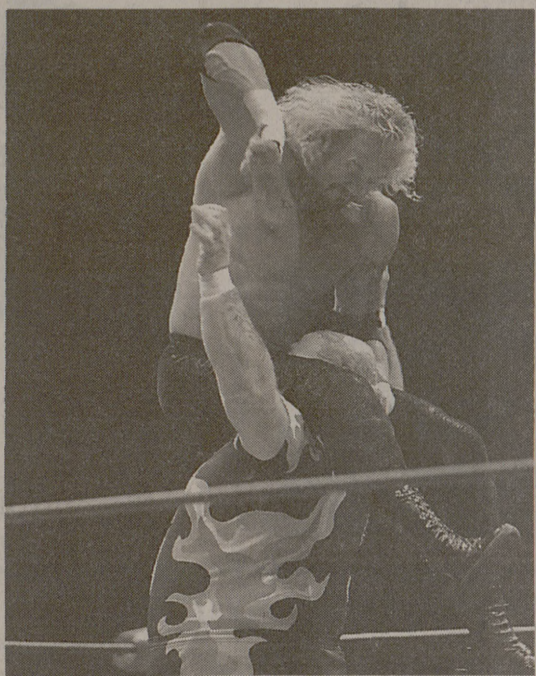

Thousands packed Reed Arena yesterday to watch the Roman circus that is World Championship Wrestling (WCW).
