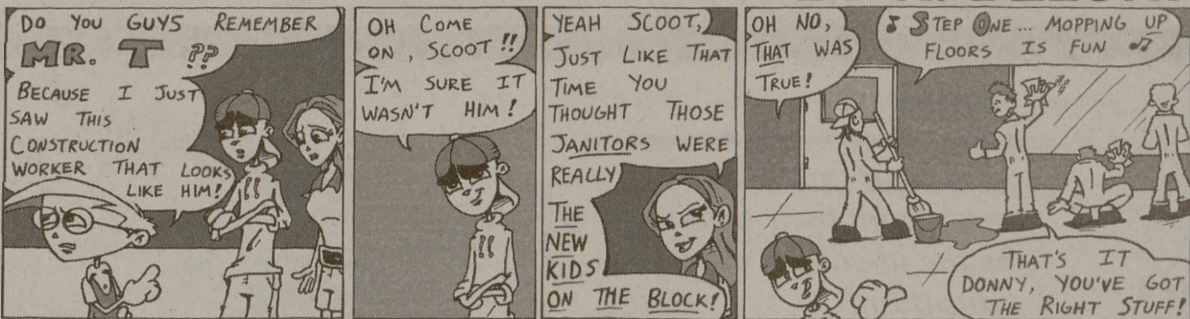

McClendon said there were a lot of people in town and it was a big weekend for college students, but the party was not sanctioned by SBSLC.

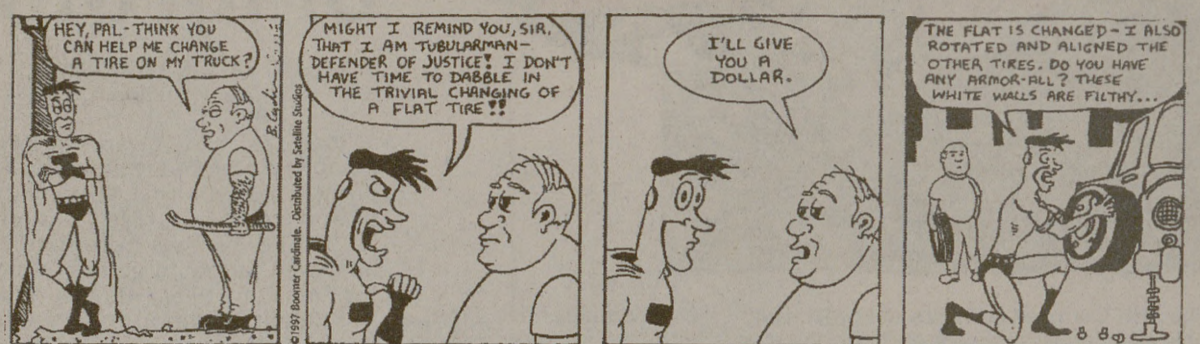
Theresa Cooper, director of SBSLC and a sophomore agricultural development major, said SBSLC leaders discouraged conference plans from attending the parties.
