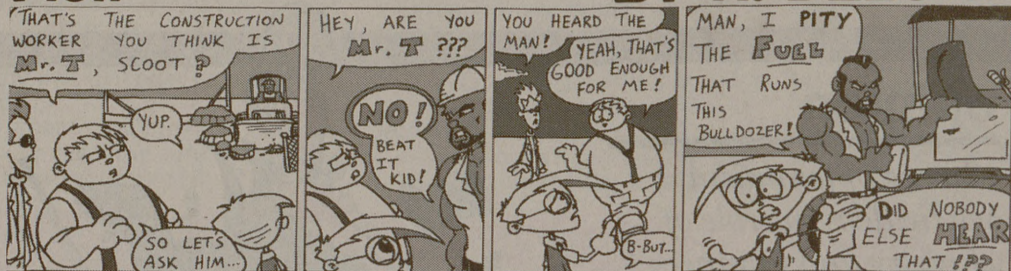

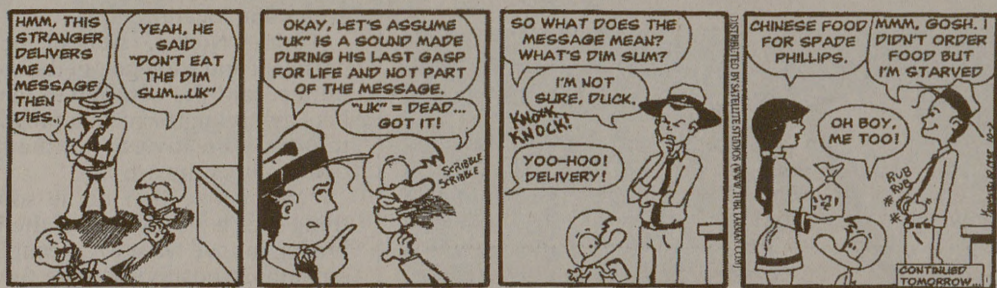

'Walking With the Presidents' Reception at MSC Arts Gallery

A reception will be held today at 7:30 p.m. in the MSC Visual Arts Gallery for the exhibit "Walking With the Presidents," a collection of historical photographs of African Americans throughout 20th century American presidential administrations. The exhibit highlights those African Americans whose lives and achievements have influenced American presidents. It is inspired by a biography of Louis Martin, who advised Kennedy, Nixon, Ford, Johnson and Carter on black candidates for appointments within their presidential administrations. The photographs were obtained from presidential libraries under the advice of the Joint Center. The exhibit is free of charge and on display through Feb. 3. It is presented by MSC Visual Arts Committee, MSC Political Forum and MSC Black Awareness Committee.

"We are about bringing together students from diverse backgrounds, experiences and values to examine their identity as leaders, professionals and citizens to their community," she said. Students eligible for the internship program are undergraduate students who have completed at least one semester of college by June 1999. Students should have an average of a 3.0 on a 4.0 scale. The program offers leadership potential, an active interest in community, good communication abilities. Students accepted into the program will be given a monthly stipend along with transportation to Washington D.C. and housing arrangements.

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
