YES! If the group condones or encourages hazing, or if an of or combination of members, pledges, or alumni commit or assis hazing, the group is also held responsible. This could lead to a loss of recognition and support by the University.

WHAT IF WE'RE NOT SURE IF OUR ACTIVITY IS HAZING?

If you have to ask yourself if what you are doing could be considered hazing, it probably is.

CAN I GET IN TROUBLE FOR REPORTING HAZING?

NO. You are protected from civil or criminal liability for report specific incidents unless you report in bad faith or with malice.
