Garth Brooks, training firemen and Aggie basketball players are among those who have attracted crowds to Reed Arena since its opening last April.

Mary Helen Bowers, associate director of special event facilities, said the versatility of Reed Arena has contributed to its success.

"It has truly proven to be a versatile building that we can do almost anything in," she said.

Bowers said Reed Arena provides a facility for traditional A&M activities, entertainment, meetings and banquets.

"Reed Arena has enabled us to have graduation and Muster in surroundings that are more comfortable for participants and guests," she said.

Bowers said both of the basketball teams have enjoyed their first season in Reed.

Bowers said Reed Arena has attracted entertainment students have previously traveled to Houston, Dallas and Austin to see.

"There is no other way for students to enjoy world-class entertainment other than Reed Arena," she said.

Bowers said the arena has been utilized for meetings by community members. She said despite the other facilities in town, the high demand for Reed Arena has made it preferable.

Steven Hodge, director of special event facilities, said state money does not support the arena. He said admission fees cover operating expenses not covered through endowments.

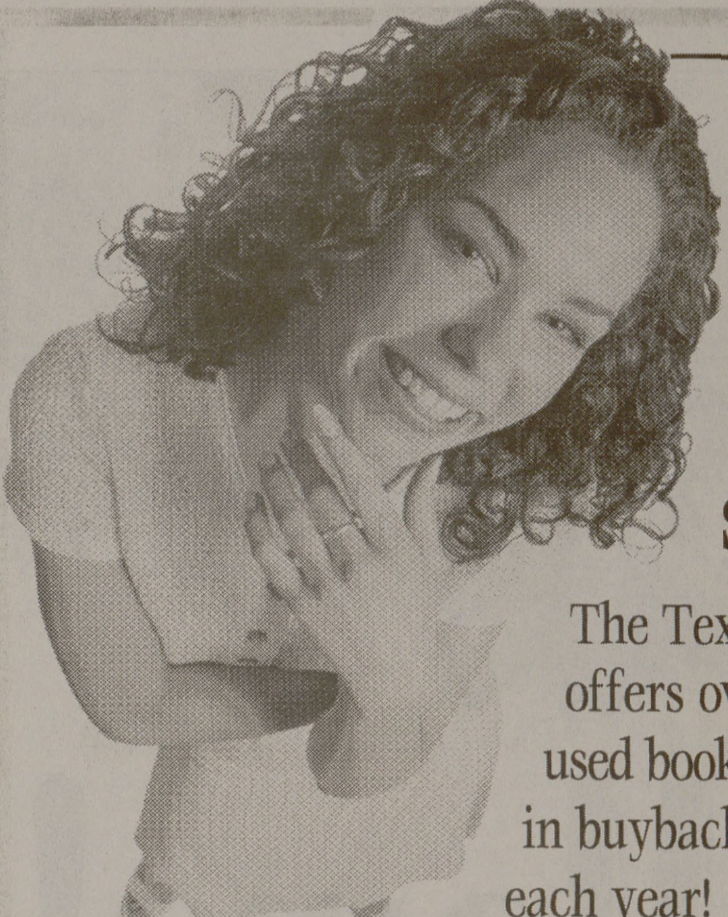

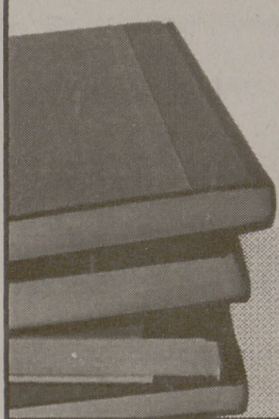

## HAZING IS ILLEGAL ANY QUESTIONS?

### WHAT IF I DON'T INTEND TO HURT ANYONE?

It doesn't matter. The actions themselves are illegal and against policy, regardless of their outcome.

### CAN THE ENTIRE GROUP BE FOUND GUILTY OF HAZING?

YES! If the group condones or encourages hazing, or if an offer or combination of members, pledges, or alumni commit or assist in hazing, the group is also held responsible. This could lead to a loss of recognition and support by the University.

### WHAT IF WE'RE NOT SURE IF OUR ACTIVITY IS HAZING?

If you have to ask yourself if what you are doing could be considered hazing, it probably is.

### CAN I GET IN TROUBLE FOR REPORTING HAZING?

NO. You are protected from civil or criminal liability for reporting specific incidents unless you report in bad faith or with malice.
