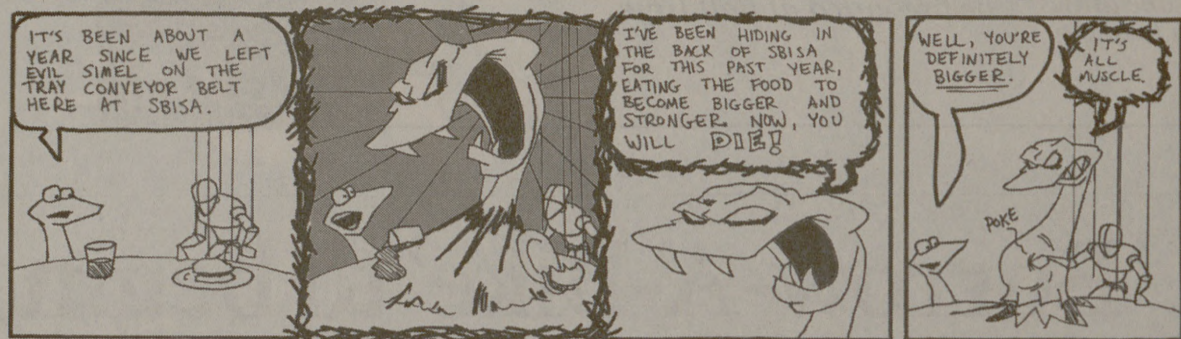


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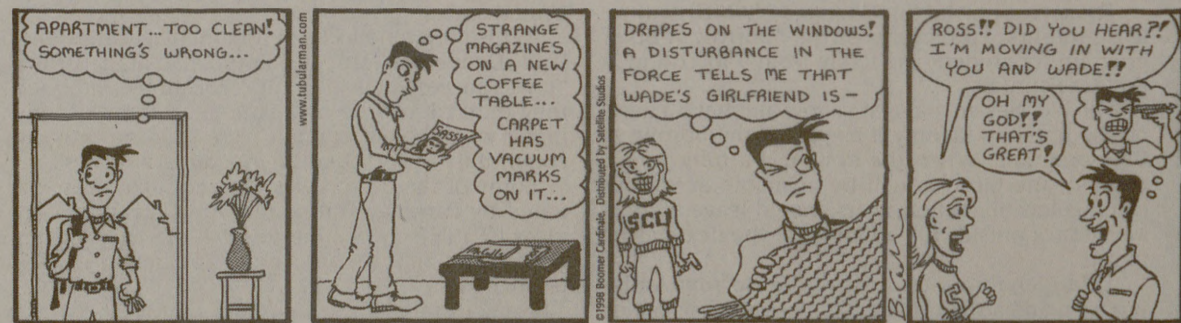

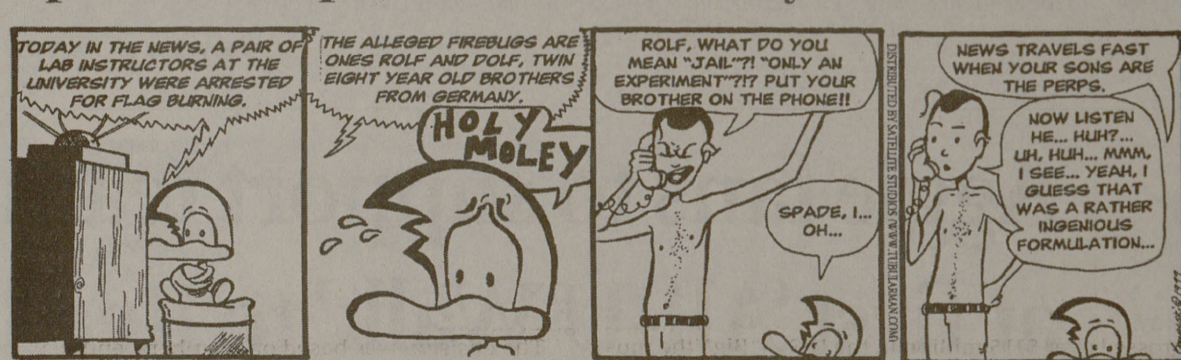

A&M Faculty Senate endorses department

Texas A&M's Faculty Senate approved numerous course additions and course changes and endorsed the proposed creation of a Department of Performance Studies, which will house the degree and faculty in theater arts and music.

Also during the Monday meeting, faculty senators approved the addition of several courses in architecture and kinesiology as components of humanities and/or visual and performing arts core.

In addition, senators endorsed a revised policy on misconduct in research, but opted to refer a Northgate Resolution back to the Faculty Senate's executive committee for additional revision.

Furthermore, senators heard reports from former speaker Wayne Wylie about a reward system for faculty members with multiple missions at Texas A&M.

A workshop will be held March 11-12 on campus to address this issue.

Also, William Perry, executive associate provost, addressed the senate about the admissions program. Faculty Senate

elections will be held. The nomination process begins March 1 and ends March 12.

All's fair in Shakespeare in Love and

Nominees for best-picture Oscars include anti-war, Elizabethan-era films.

BEVERLY HILLS, Calif. (AP) — Attesting to Hollywood's fascination with World War II, three movies set against the war — *Saving Private Ryan*, *The Thin Red Line* and *Life Is Beautiful* — were nominated Tuesday for best-picture Oscars and will go up against two Elizabethan-era tales, *Shakespeare in Love* and *Elizabeth*.

"I think this is a tribute to the veterans," Steven Spielberg said of the 11 nominations for his brutally

realistic *Private Ryan*. "It's important that before this century is out ample recognition is paid to the veterans who saved the world."

At least eight movies dealing with the war have won the Academy Award for best picture, including Spielberg's own *Schindler's List* in 1993.

Shakespeare in Love, a rollicking romance about the Bard seeking his muse, emerged with a leading 13 nominations, one shy of the record 14 for *Titanic* last year and *All About Eve* in 1950. *Elizabeth*, about the intrigues behind the throne, tied with *The Thin Red Line* and *Life Is Beautiful* with seven nominations.

The most wins for a movie is 11, a record shared by 1959's *Ben-Hur*

and last year's *Titanic*.

The Oscars will be held March 21 on ABC, with Goldberg back for a second year.

The nominations are unusual snubs and inclusions.

The *Truman Show* nominations for director Weir and screenwriter Niccol, but missed out on the star, Jim Carrey, wasn't nominated. *Elizabeth* was overlooked.

But mostly the nod spoke to Hollywood America's — intense war II, with three of the picture nominees set in that period.
