

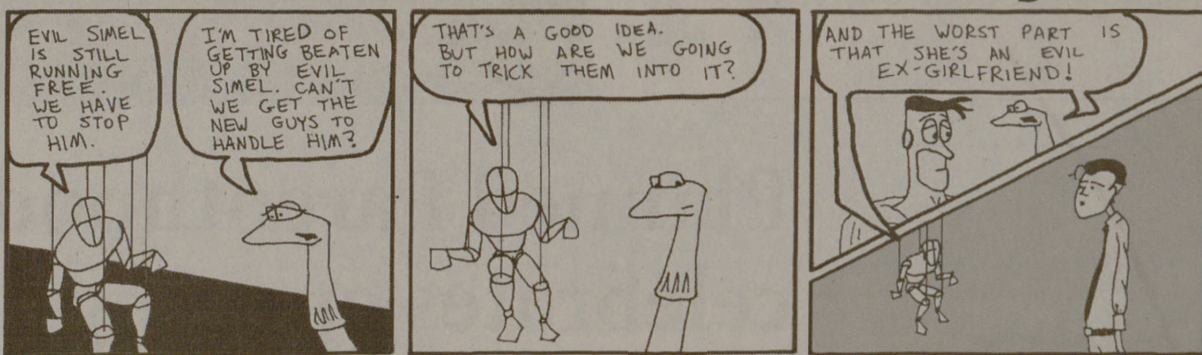

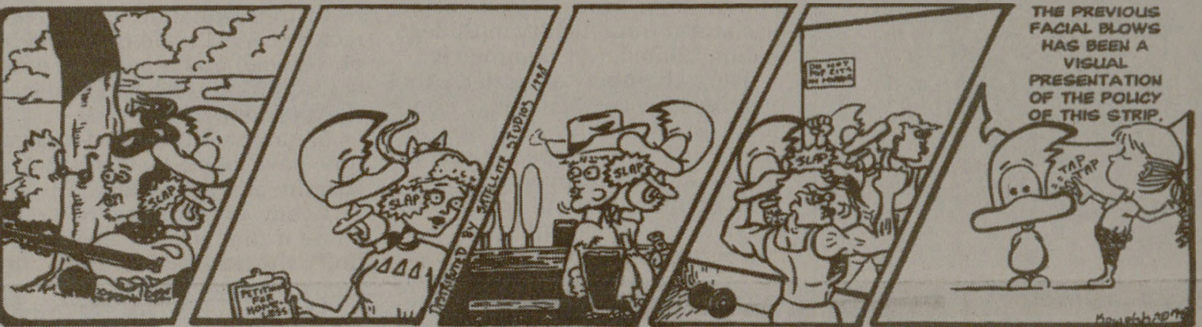

"Part of the difficulty in the real world is that the bad guys don't work 8 to 5," he said.

Maj. Curt Carver, a member of the gold team and a computer science graduate student, said the class provides students an opportunity to learn through participation.

"In the past, the Department of Justice, the Air Force and the *New York Times* have been attacked," he said. "The bad guys (hackers) can take over [Websites] and put their own information up."

Marti said the goal of the black team is to recognize the weaknesses in the gold team's network system and attack the system without being detected.

"It's no good to break into the system and be detected," he said. "You don't break into a store just to get your face on a video and leave your wallet on the counter. Students are learning how to break-in, steal the information and not be detected by the gold team."

Students have invested more than 100 hours in the class building the network security system. They are involved in a 24-hour-per-day exercise to invade it.
