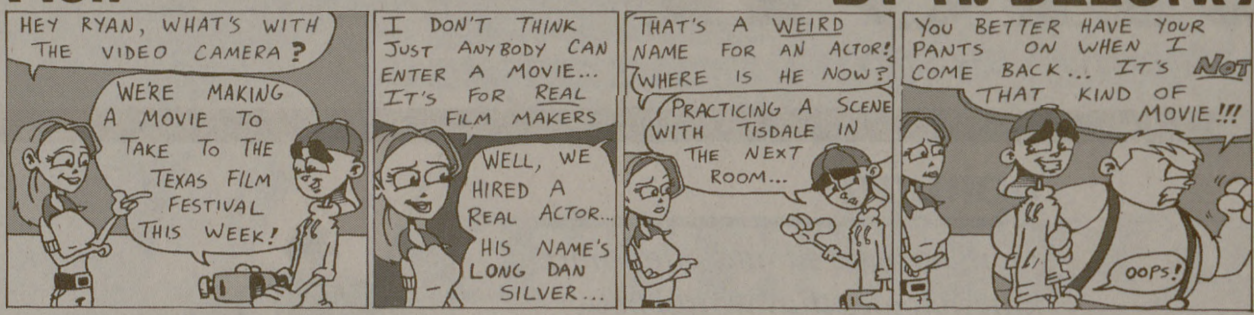

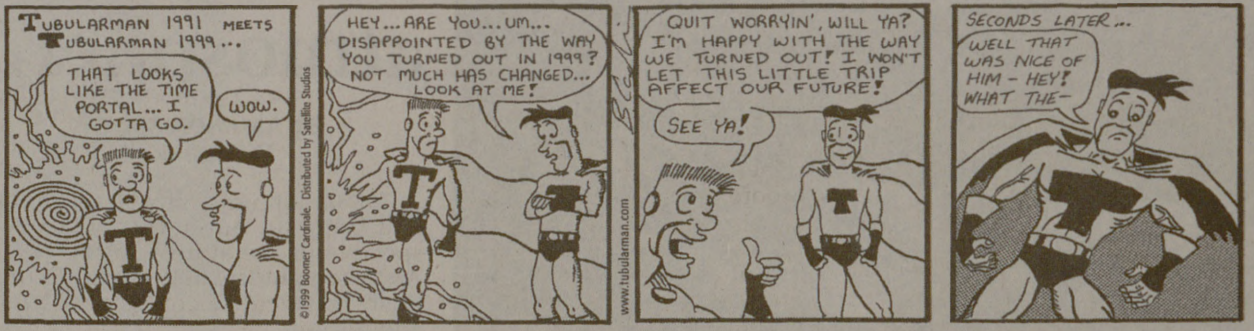

Gov. Bush names three new regents

Gov. George W. Bush announced the appointment of members to the Texas A&M University Board of Regents. Lionel Sosa of San Antonio, Steve Stevens of Houston and Susan Wynn of Benbrook will replace three members whose terms have expired. "These are excellent appointees with a diverse experience who bring valuable insight and strong leadership to the Board," Bush said in a press release. The appointees are subject to Texas Senate approval before they begin their terms.

Leadership groups target freshmen

Motivation of college freshmen, a theme incorporated into the missions of Texas A&M freshman-

leadership organizations, was spread to other universities at a conference this weekend. Members of Freshman Leaders In Progress (FLIP), Aggie Fish Club (AFC), Fish Aides, Leaders of Tomorrow (ALOT) and Leaders In Freshman Engineering (LIFE) hosted delegates from Texas, Arkansas, Oklahoma, Tennessee, Kansas and Iowa universities and discussed freshman leadership organizations and programs offered for incoming freshmen.

Jeremy Nelson, a director of the conference and a senior computer science major, said the conference and participants discussed ways to improve their existing freshman leadership organizations and ways to establish non-existing ones. Conference On Freshman Leadership Organizations (COFLO), a new A&M group, was formed to host the conference and to offer itself as a resource to the delegates.

"I heard from a Cal-Tech professor once that 'Success means obtaining or attaining what you want, and happiness means wanting what you get.'"

Lia Xu, an attendee from Dallas, said she learned from the workshops how to accept criticism constructively.

"I really saw that I need to let any kind of criticism or conflicts from bringing me down for a long time and prevent me from moving forward in my career," she said.

Nancy Magnussen, director of the WISE conference said she thinks this year's conference was a success, and planners are already scheduling speakers for next year.

Crumpton told the audience in order to stay positive they have to create a cycle of positivity which includes positive input, a positive center and positive output.

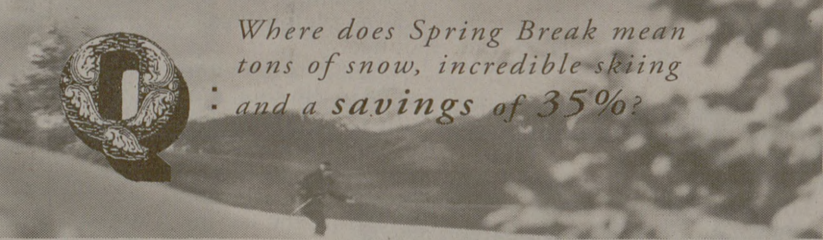
Hargrove said there are many ethical debates concerning the environment.

"At one point, the director of the U.S. Geological Survey did not want to make efforts to help the preservation of Yosemite National

Park because he felt it was God's business to take care of it," he said.
