Accessibility, services of Web based listings increase with new computers

The Human Resources Department will introduce its recently-installed employment computers, which will increase the accessibility and services the office provides to prospective A&M employees.

The computers are in the off-campus employment office, and the demonstration will be today at 11 a.m. in the employment office facility located on University Drive.

The department began a Web-based job listing in November of 1998, but prior to the computer installation in the employment office, prospective employees could only access the human resources web page containing applications and information through personal com-

puters or public-use computers.

Terry Jacques, staffing assistant in the employment office, said the demonstration is meant to publicize the new employment computers, which increase services to people who do not otherwise have access to computers.

The newly installed employment computers will simplify the application process for prospective A&M employees by allowing them to access job openings and fill out the required nine-page application online while in the employment office. After filling out the online application, applicants submit it to the office for job openings.

Larry Potts, associate director of the Human Resources Department, said the online-application process will increase the accessibility of the

employment office and allow prospective employees to use more professional applications.

"We at Texas A&M are committed to making it as easy as possible for anyone seeking employment at the University to find the job they want," Potts said in a press release.

Potts said the employment computers will ease the process for prospective employees.

"We [at the University] ourselves are the Brazos Valley," Potts said.

In addition to Potts, Gaston, vice president of the Human Resources Department, will speak at the dem-

Conference promotes quality food service

The Texas A&M University Food Services Department will host a conference February 24-26 to discuss the future of food service and promote quality food service on school, college and university campuses.

The 1999 Region VII National Association of College and University Food Services Conference (NACUFS) will bring 150 representatives from Region VII to the A&M campus.

Cindy Zawieja, associate director of the Food Services Department, said conference sessions will address renovation, leadership, self-branding and franchising.

Zawieja said they will use Sbsa Dining Hall as a case study to teach aspects of renovation.

"We will use Sbsa as an example

on how to get ideas for remodeling and how to work with architects," she said.

Zawieja said during the past two summers, food services relocated Sbsa's dish room and added an entryway.

"By the year 2000, Sbsa should also have new floors, roof and plumbing," she said.

She said the fast-food aspect of Sbsa will change to a brand-name concept with an international section and a 1950s diner. The regular dining area will have a market concept.

Zawieja said self-branding and franchising are the future of food service.

Examples of franchising are Chick-fil-A and Whataburger in the Underground Food Court, and examples of self-branding are Ol'

Armydillos and Elephant MSC.

Susan Flechtner, director for the Center for Development, will speak on effective habits for effective development.

The conference will run from 12:35 to 3:30 p.m. through 231.

Zawieja said students, including Student Government Association, are invited to sample the food.

"Student input is important," she said. "If they like something, we may consider it for our menus."

Zawieja said all students are invited to attend the conference as long as they are on campus.

"It will be a fantastic day," she said.


