

Aggie women fall to Sooners

22-3 run by OU, turnovers undermine A&M in first half

The University of Oklahoma was just too much for the Texas A&M Women's Team Wednesday as the Sooners overwhelmed the Aggies, 95-69.

The Aggies were able to keep it close until midway through the first half, when Oklahoma went on a 22-3 run. Most of the points came off A&M's 15 first-half turnovers.

A&M coach Peggie Gillom felt the team's intensity level was just not as high as the Sooners'.

"We just didn't crank it up in the be-ginning, and they did," Gillom said. That was just an old-fashioned buttkicking tonight.

It was freshman LaNeisha Caufield pacing the way for the Sooners with 20 first-half points. But her shooting was not the only thing hurting the Aggies in the first period, as they were unable to hit a basket for the final 3:15 of the first half.

The second half was not much different for A&M, as Oklahoma came out


Gillom said she was not sure how to feel about a final rematch between A&M and Oklahoma.


