



Baseball opens Big 12p Aggies host Oklahoma State University in three-games

The eighth-ranked Texas A&M Baseball Team will face its toughest challenge of the early season this weekend when they host 19thranked Oklahoma State University. This series has always been close since these two teams usually mirror each other.

Oklahoma State comes into the series riding a five game winning streak with an 8-1 record. They bring in a team that combines a mixture of strong hitting and pitching.

Game one of the series will see a pitching duel between two of the top pitchers in the country. OSU will hurl their staff ace Matt Smith against A&M's lefty ace, Casey Fossum. 
