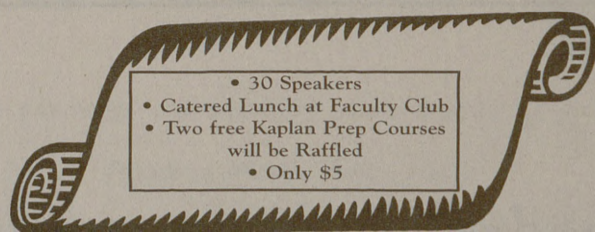

## Ags hand OSU first Big 12 sweep

The brooms were out in full effect Sunday as the Texas A&M Baseball Team completed a three-game sweep of Oklahoma State University, the first time OSU has ever been swept in a Big 12 series. The Aggies, ranked eighth nationally, are now 12-2 overall and 3-0 in Big 12 play.

Friday's game featured a pitching duel between two sophomores — OSU's Brad Smith and A&M's Casey Fossum.

The Cowboys took a three-run lead into the seventh inning, but a four-run rally powered by junior Steve Scarborough gave the Aggies a lead they did not surrender. Fossum did not allow another run as the Aggies won, 5-3.

"I just wanted to go out there and pitch to win the game," said Fossum. "I can't remember ever staying in and winning a close game like this one."

Fossum struck out 10 OSU batters and gave up one unearned run in the eight innings he pitched.

Junior Chance Caple turned in another strong pitching performance in the second game of the series, pitch-

ing a complete game in the Aggies' 7-4 victory. Known for his placement, Caple overpowered the OSU hitters, whiffing nine of them.

"Chance really had a great game to-

ering a home run over the wall. Junior centerfielder Stephen Truitt added some late insurance, launching a shot that hit the foul pole for his fifth home run of the year.

The momentum was what the Aggies needed Sunday as a hard game was played before more than 4,500 fans at Olsen Field.

OSU was able to grab a 3-1 lead in the bottom of the ninth. Down to the last out of the game, the Aggies began their rally.

Scarborough slapped an RBI up the middle to give the Aggies a runner for a chance to tie it. Scarborough would go for more than as Steven Truitt sent the ball over the left-field wall to claim win for the Aggies.

"I was thinking slider the time because he threw three strikes previously to Screech (Scarborough)," Truitt said. "He just got right in the hit zone, and I got from there."

"This entire weekend just us a great amount of momentum heading into the games that we need to keep this up," Truitt said.
