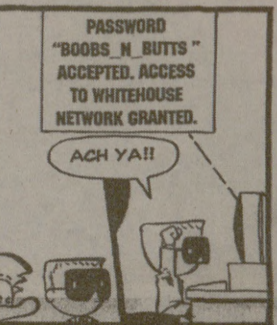
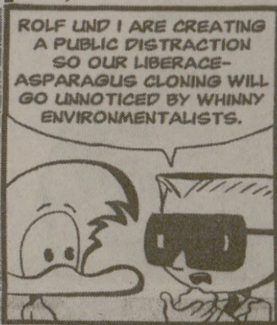
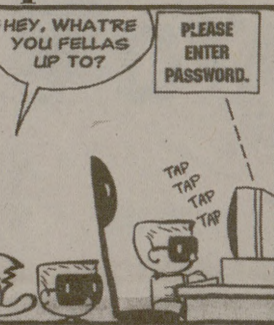

recovered much of the 42 percent of the property recovered this academic year. Since September, 227 bicycles have been reported stolen on campus.

Of the \$243,763 worth of property stolen during the 1997-98 academic year, only \$46,783 worth was recovered.

Baron said most theft involves bicycles, car stereos, student identification cards and backpacks.
