Complaints filed against Methodist ministers Oscars place #1 in participating in lesbian marriage ceremonies Nielsen Media ratings

ACRAMENTO, Calif. (AP) — Methodist bishop for Northrn California filed a complaint uesday against 69 ministers o participated in a lesbian holy union ceremony" in mass efiance of a church ban on ame-sex marriages.

The complaint is the first step vard a possible church trial for Rev. Don Fado, who presided the Jan. 15 celebration, and the er ministers. If convicted, they ould be removed from the clergy. Bishop Melvin Talbert, head of 375-church California-Nevada nited Methodist Conference, said brought the complaint with orrow and regret.

Talbert said the church's ban n ceremonies recognizing gay reationships is an "act of injustice." ut he said church law required to act on a complaint brought two pastors.

I will uphold law, but I will not silenced. I will continue speakout against the law and will ntinue working to change the sition of our church to be more keeping with the teachings and npassion of Jesus," he said.

Fado did not return a call for comment Tuesday.

The conflict over same-sex weddings has been simmering for years within the United Methodist Church, which with 8.5 million members is the nation's second-biggest Protestant denomination after the Southern

Fado led the wedding-like celebration for Jeanne Barnett, 68, and Ellie Charlton, 63. The women have long been active in Fado's church, St. Marks United Methodist, and have been a couple for more than 15 years.

More than 1,000 members of the clergy, gays and others attended the ceremony, which was held at the Sacramento Community Center and included folk

songs, dancing and poetry. While Fado presided, the other ministers lined up on risers on the stage to chant the blessing that Fado proclaimed could land them all in trouble with church officials: "O God, our maker, we gladly proclaim to the world that Jeanne and Ellie are loving partners together for life."






