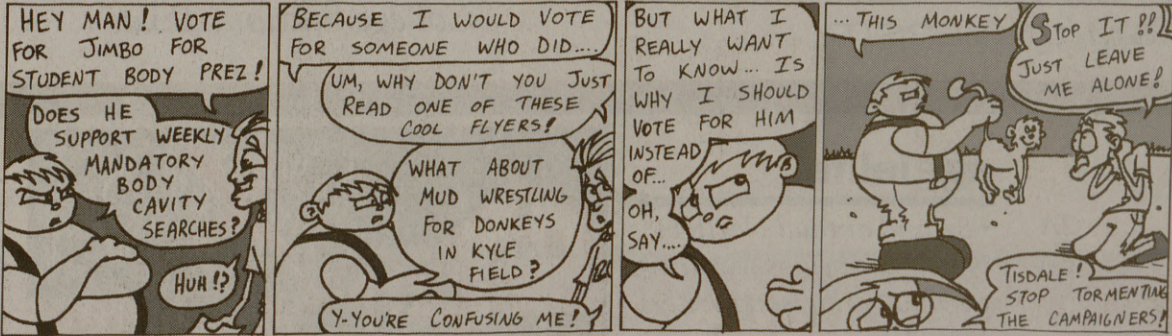

Holocaust survivor tells of camp conditions

Sol Wachsberg, survivor of the Holocaust, shared his personal experiences in concentration camps and educated Texas A&M students on the Holocaust of World War II in an effort to help prevent history from repeating itself.

Dr. Arnold Krammer, a history professor at Texas A&M, said it is important for students to learn from people who experienced the parts of history they learn about.

"There's no better way to learn history than to talk to the people who were there," he said.

Wachsberg said effects were immediately felt in Poland during the beginning of World War II, with planes flying over and casualties oc-

curing within the first few hours of the war.

Wachsberg said Jewish people began evacuating their homes within the first two days of fighting, but they were overrun by the Germans and forced to return. Wachsberg said, as the first atrocities of the war began, Polish people were required to work for the Germans and children were not allowed to attend school.

Wachsberg was taken to a concentration camp at age 14 and eventually passed through 11 camps.

Wachsberg said there was a total of 9,000 concentration camps during the war, and they varied in terms of living conditions. He said some provided decent sanitary conditions, but the poor sanitation of other camps caused outbreaks of typhus

and dysentery.

Wachsberg said most weighed less than 100 pounds, many did not awake in the mornings, having died during the night.

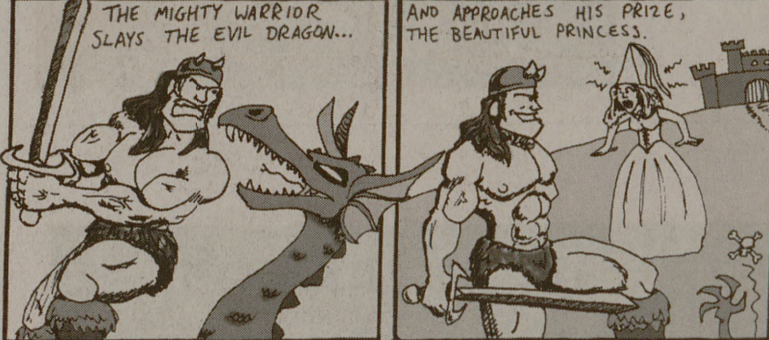
Wachsberg said he was a village in Czechoslovakia, war ended, and the people stored his health.

Leslie McDonald, a student history major, said Wachsberg to remember what he learned from his experiences and children about them.

"He came to A&M because it happened, but to be alert so this won't happen," McDonald said.

Krammer said the special opportunity for students to see and hear one of the living survivors of the Holocaust

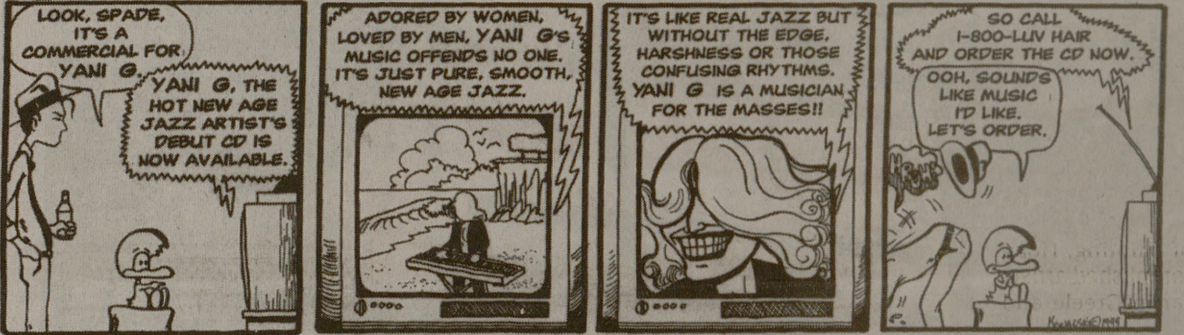
