"Few expenditures affect as many consumers as auto insurance," Wentworth said, in a press release. "Yet in an age of deregulation, Texans today do not enjoy the benefits of free-market-price competition on this important cost, despite the fact it is mandated by the state. This measure will bring some long-needed reform to this area and could result in savings up to one-half billion dollars annually for Texas consumers.

"Under current law, our Texas Department of Insurance uses the Texas Auto Manual, which lumps drivers into a few broad categories," Wentworth said. "This means that good drivers tend to pay too much and drivers with poorer records tend to pay too lit-
