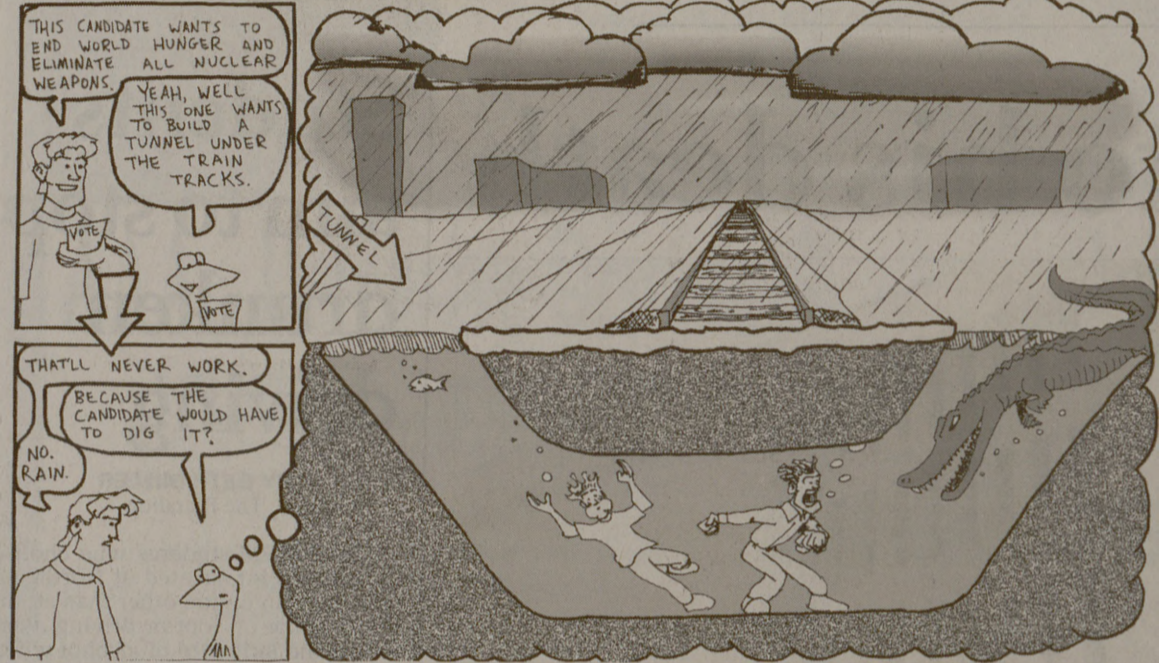
### AMA president to give speech

### Confessions to be recorded

AUSTIN (AP) — State requiring that confessions be recorded or written in order to be used as evidence would be changed in various instances under a proposal proved by the Senate. Lt. Gov. Rick Perry has introduced a bill by Sen. Ken Miller, D-Victoria, to eliminate the requirement. The measure did not get enough support last week to be brought up for a vote. As amended and passed today, the bill would put into effect existing practice of allowing statements to be used if the accused person testifies and a different story on the stand. The bill as amended also set out specifications for such statements to be used if an alibi is asserted by the person.
