# No-hitter leaves Aggies swinging

**Softball Team falls to 3-2 in conference**

No. 15 University of Texas took home a 1-0 win over the No. 18 Texas A&M Softball Team Friday at the Aggie Softball Complex thanks to a no-hitter by All-American pitcher Christa Williams.

The loss drops the Aggies to 3-2 in Big 12 play and 31-9 overall.

A&M pitcher Amy Vining did her best to keep the Aggies in the game after giving up a solo home run to senior All-American Nikki Cockrell in the first inning. Following Cockrell's homer, Vining went on to allow just six hits and one walk for the game with one strikeout.

The Aggies' only scoring threats came in the first and seventh innings, with both rallies dying with runners left on second base.

In the first inning, Aggie second baseman Rachel Lewis drew a lead-off walk. Angie Long would advance Lewis to second with a sacrifice fly, but Williams retired the next two Aggie batters to end the inning.

A&M again threatened to score in the seventh when Longhorn third baseman Keely Franks committed an error, putting Aggie junior Jamie

Smith on first to lead off the inning. Sophomore Amanda Whalen, called in to pinch hit for the Aggies, proceeded to advance Smith to second with a sacrifice bunt.

But again, the Aggies would not be able to make it to third as Williams struck out high-school

teammate Heather Martinez and forced Stephanie Trumbell to ground out to end the inning.

Williams' performance was her first no-hitter of the season and the fifth of her career.

The game marked the first time the Aggies have been held without a

hit since the 1995 season. Williams, a University of Arizona's softball player, tossed one in the PONY League in Fullerton, Calif.

The Aggies will return to action Wednesday when they face F. Austin State University at the Aggie Softball Complex.

## Caminiti's return bumps Johnson to minor league

HOUSTON (AP) — The Houston Astros final roster decision is no surprise.

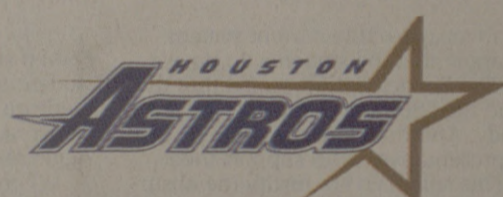
Third baseman Ken Caminiti is back. Infielder Russ Johnson is going back to the Triple A New Orleans Zephyrs.

Caminiti, who missed 10 games in Florida because of a sinus infection, was expected to join the Astros Sunday in New Orleans for their final exhibition against the Zephyrs. He is scheduled to join the team in Houston for Monday's workout in the Astrodome.

The 35-year-old, who last played for the Astros in 1994 before being traded to San Diego, missed playing time because of flu-like symptoms, a turf toe and most recently the sinus in-

fection. He was limited to 28 at-bats during spring training.

Meanwhile, Johnson, a third baseman, will



head to New Orleans for a third straight season because the Astros have no more room on their roster. Had Caminiti not been ready to start, John-

son likely would have remained on the roster.

"It gets old after a while," Johnson said. "I was in the *Houston Chronicle* in Sunday's edition. I was an 8-year-old hit .241 in 54 at-bats this spring. It's upsetting they can't make room for me in the big leagues."

The Astros open the 1999 regular season Tuesday night in Houston against the Chicago Cubs. Astros outfielder Moises Alou, who had surgery in February, has been placed on the day disabled list. The outfielder will miss the majority of the 1999 campaign after surgery to repair a torn anterior cruciate ligament that he suffered while working out in spring training.
