The loss drops the Aggies to 3-2 in Big 12 play and 31-9 overall.

A&M pitcher Amy Vining did her best to keep the Aggies in the game after giving up a solo home run to senior All-American Nikki Cockrell in the first inning. Following Cockrell's homer, Vining went on to allow just six hits and one walk for the game with one strikeout:


