that spearheaded a private effort to build a retractable-roof, downtown ballpark agreed Wednesday to pay more than \$100 million to name the stadium Enron Field.

Officials for Enron and the Houston Astros declined to be specific on financial details, except to say the naming-rights fee would be paid over 30 years and that Enron also would build a large parking garage worth another \$30 mil-

The deal also includes the right for Enron Energy Services, a subsidiary, to manage the facility. That could include providing power if the Texas Legislature deregulates the electricity industry as expected.

"We'll do what we do best, which is manage energy and facilities, and we'll let the Astros do what they do best, which is winning baseball games," Ken Lay, Enron chair, said.

The 30-year management contract could run

The estimated \$300 million Houston stadium complex had gone by the working title 'Ballpark at Union Station" until Wednesday. Officials dropped the name of the 88-year-old train depot, which shadows left field.




