Men's Tennis Team to host

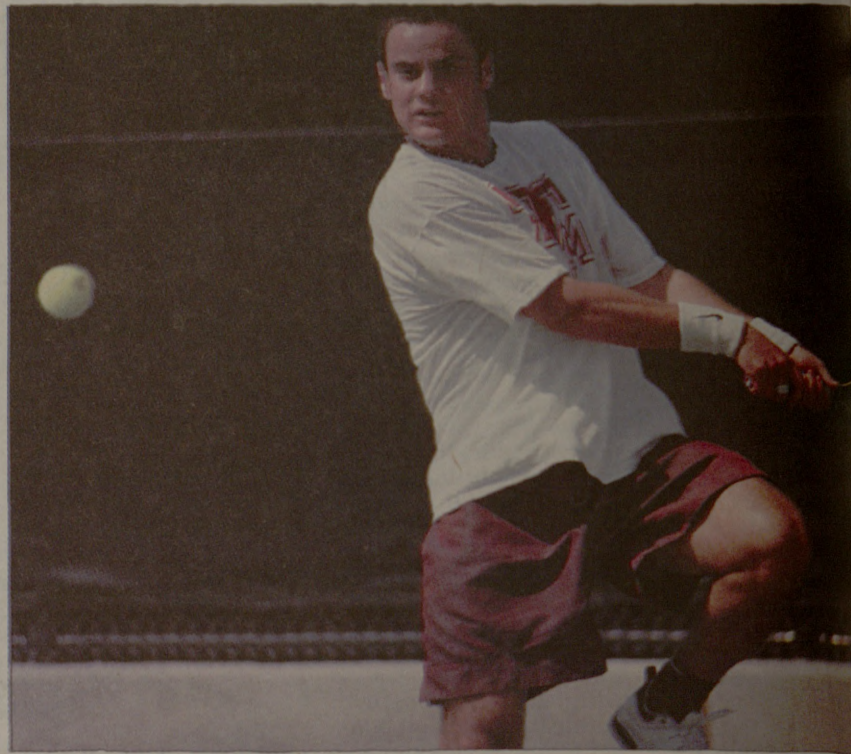
The No. 14 Texas A&M Men's Tennis Team will resume conference play tonight at the A&M Varsity Tennis Center with a 6 p.m. match against the University of Colorado. The Aggies (12-3, 4-0) will then cap off their weekend with a road trip to Lawrence, Kan., Sunday to face No. 40 University of Kansas.

The Aggies are coming off a tough loss last Sunday to No. 17 Pepperdine University in Malibu, Calif. After sweeping all three doubles matches to win the doubles point, the team fell apart, dropping five of six singles matches.

The Aggies were scheduled to end their Southern California swing with a match Tuesday against No. 1 UCLA, but rain caused the cancellation of the match, sending A&M home early. In tonight's match the Aggies will look to exact revenge on the unranked Buffaloes. A&M traveled to Boulder last season to take on Colorado and lost, 5-2. The defeat was especially damaging to the Aggies, as it gave them their second conference loss and ended their hopes of winning the Big 12 regular season championship.

Leading the Aggies tonight will be the doubles tandem of sophomores Shuon Madden and Dumitru Caradima. For the fourth consecutive rankings period, the duo has been ranked No. 1 in the nation. On Sunday, they defeated the nation's No. 11 doubles team, Pepperdine's Kelly Gullett and John Hui.

The Aggies have claimed the all-important doubles point in 12 of their 15 matches, and Sunday's loss to the Waves was the Aggies' first loss despite winning the doubles point.

On Sunday, the Aggies will play their last conference road match of the season against the Jayhawks, who were swept last season in College Station.

NFL investigating Cowboys' salary-cap deal

NEW YORK (AP) — The NFL is investigating complaints from other teams that the Dallas Cowboys may have violated the league's salary cap rules by locking up players they had not yet signed.

League spokesperson Leslie Hammond said Thursday the league was looking into allegations involving center Mark Stepnoski, wide receiver Raghieb Ismail and linebacker Quentin Coryatt. She had no further comment.

Last month, it was reported the Cowboys had come to terms on mul-

tiyear contracts with the three free agents, but did not actually sign them.

The *New York Times* reported several teams said they recently contacted agents for the three, but in each case was told the player no longer was available.

Some of the teams said they conducted their own investigations and determined that an arrange-

ment had been reached between the Cowboys and the players.

At that point, according to *The Times*, at least several of the teams complained to the league. They told NFL officials they believed the Cowboys had reached verbal or written agreements with the players but had not signed them to a contract to circumvent cap rules.

The league then began to explore the situation, according to team executives, union officials and agents the newspaper did not identify.

The league offers a reward for anyone who can prove that a team has cap rules.

If found guilty, a team could be fined millions of dollars, barred, at least temporarily, from using the players involved, or using the players involved.

At least two of the teams complained believe they may have hidden a deal from the league. Under the current rules, a team must disclose the message to the league and wanted to keep the deal secret.
