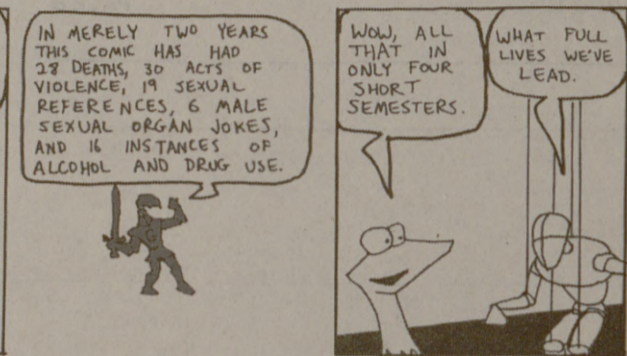

"Go Texan was chosen because a lot of the money raised will return to A&M and Blinn [College] in the form of scholarships," he said.

Durham said Sigma Alpha Epsilon does not know the total amount of money raised for the charity, but it expects profits to exceed last year's.

"This year we had about 50 more teams enter than last year," he said. "Each four-man private team paid \$75 to enter, and each four-man corporate team paid \$100 to enter."

Durham said a major change in organizing this year's Chilifest was promoting the park-and-ride from Parking Area 5 to the Zachry Building, to the grounds.

"A lot of people used and-ride shuttle this year. It kept a lot of people off the streets who might have been driving."
