## Book to address women's health

The increasing need for information about women's health has resulted in the publication of the book *Contemporary Women's Health* by Dr. Danny Ballard, professor of health in the Department of Health and Kinesiology; Dr. Cheryl Kolander, professor of health at the University of Louisville; and Dr. Cindy Chandler, professor of counseling psychology at the University of North Texas.

Ballard said the book addresses rape and crisis awareness, substance-abuse awareness, consumer health issues and reproduction information. The book contains journal pages at the end of each chapter for readers to record reactions and personal health-status assessments.

"We decided we wanted women to examine their experiences and to record how they felt," Ballard said in a press release. "The best way to do that was to include the 'Journal Activity' segment so women could record their own emotions about that topic or chapter."

She said the book was written because many universities lack an informational book for teaching

women's health. "Most of the women's health books were [medical doctors] and are about diseases in prevention and medicine," Ballard said. "We're more interested in their health and well-being to maintain and improve their health. It's the positive side of women's health."

Ballard said most health research uses men and assumes women will respond to similar results. The authors included a "Her Stories" section based on women's testimonies. Ballard said that of all ages were used in a variety of situations.

The book was used this past fall in a course (HLTH 334) and will be used in fall 1999 for women's health. Ballard said women oversaw the project during the writing and editing stages. She said that mental editors and copy editors were women. "It was fun to work with women through the process," Ballard said.

Universities nationwide and several public nursing organizations have discovered the book use it as a supplemental teaching device.

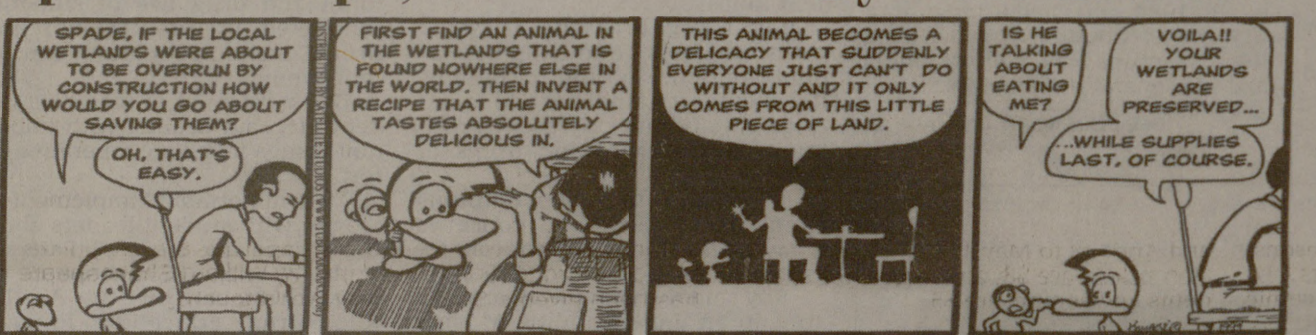
