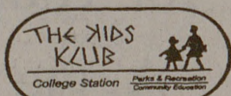

Quest for respect leads to Austin
Texas A&M track team's return to Myers Stadium for Quad

The Texas A&M Women's Track Team is probably wondering what it has to do to earn some respect on the national scene. After a weekend in which the women broke the Anderson Track record in the 4x100-meter relay, had 11 NCAA provisionally-qualifying performances and set two school records, the women dropped one spot, from 14th to 15th, in the latest Trackwire Online national poll.

Both the men and women will travel to Austin Saturday to compete in the Texas Quad Meet at the Mike A. Myers Stadium, where the women will get their chance to disprove the pollsters against Rice University, the University of Houston and second-ranked University of Texas.

The Texas women, who trail top-ranked Louisiana State University by one point in the polls, will be running their athletes at their best for the first time this season, meaning the Aggies will get to see where they stand on the national level.

A&M track and field coach Ted Nelson said although Texas is running its full squad, he will not do the same with his teams.

"We've got some people that we're going to hold out, probably three or four," Nelson said. "We'll try to be at full strength for the Big 12 [Championships]."

The highlight of the meet could be the women's 4x100 relay, which will send the Aggie women up against a Longhorns squad that just covered the relay in 42.90 seconds, the fourth-fastest collegiate time ever. A&M is coming off a qualifying performance of 44.69 seconds with which they placed second while breaking the previous stadium record. Nelson said he expects that competing against a faster relay unit will help the women improve.

"Texas has some super sprinters on their team," Nelson said. "We're going to run better with them out there."

The women also take some individual national rankings into the meet. Junior Chimika Carter currently is fourth on the NCAA qualifying list after last week's win in the 100-meter hurdles, while sophomore Esther Eisenlauer and freshman Katy Doyle are ranked fourth and sixth, respectively, on the NCAA pole-vault list.

The men, who currently are unranked, also will get their chance to go up against nationally ranked squads as fifth-ranked Texas and 17th-ranked

Houston will compete along with the Baylor Invitational. The meet also holds significance as the first scored meet held in the stadium. The Texas Relays, held two weeks ago, was the first meet on the new oval. Texas hoping coaches and athletes will use the new complex, as UT hopes to host the Championships.

The meet gets underway with the 8 a.m., while running events will begin at 9 a.m.

UConn's El-Amin sentenced to 1 day community service

STORRS, Conn. (AP) — An emotional Khalid El-Amin apologized Thursday to his family, his teammates and the people of Connecticut and Minnesota for his arrest on marijuana possession charges.

The Connecticut point guard, joined by coach Jim Calhoun at a news conference in Gampel Pavilion,

called the actions leading to his arrest Tuesday evening "a gross error of judgment."

"I have earned the respect of this state, and I want the chance to prove myself," he said. "To all the people who have supported me ... I am very sorry for this incident."

The 19-year-old Minneapolis na-

tive, a sophomore majoring in communications, was stopped for a traffic violation in Hartford, and a small amount of marijuana was discovered during a pat-down search.

UConn scoring leader Richard Hamilton was in the car, but was not charged. El-Amin also publicly apologized to Hamilton on Thursday.

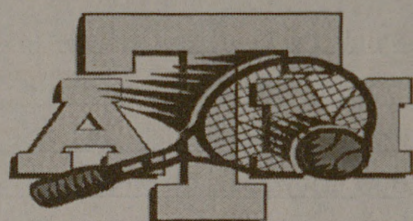
Calhoun has stood since the arrest, and called him an "asset" to the team and the program.

Calhoun also mentioned that El-Amin was part of a victory parade in Hartford.

"I would tie him up to ensure he's on the floor," Calhoun said.

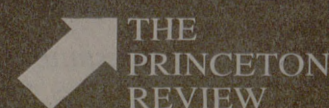
