Track teams finish second at Aus

The Texas A&M Men's and Women's Track and Field Teams came home Saturday from Myers Stadium in Austin with one conclusion — when it comes to competing with nationally ranked teams they belong. Rice University and the University of Houston do not.

The men finished second to fifth-ranked University of Texas and soundly defeated 17th-ranked Houston and unranked Rice. The women's meet produced an identical order of finish, with No. 2 Texas winning the team title over A&M, Houston and Rice.

The men led off the competition with sophomore Brian Oubre and junior Jim Pat Darcey finishing second and third in the 3,000-meter steeplechase with times of 9 minutes, 50 seconds and 10:05, respectively.

In the 400-meter dash, junior Johan Lanefors took second at 47.21 seconds, and senior Derrick Woods took third with a time of 48.33,

while seniors Billy Fobbs and Toya Jones went 1-3 in the 100-meter dash with times of 10.66 and 10.73.

Juniors Travis McAshan and Keith Bender brought the Aggies another second-third finish in the 400-meter hurdles after posting times of 50.61 and 52.72, respectively.

Following the 2-3 theme were junior Scott Lengefeld, who covered 3,000 meters in 8:26, and senior Stephen Erath, who finished in 8:29.

The men's relays continued to improve as the 4x400-meter relay team notched the win in 3:05.33, while the 4x100-meter squad placed second in 39.78.

The field events produced two individual winners, junior Jason Jacob in the hammer throw with a toss of 180 feet, 8 inches and junior Travis Grasha in the javelin with a mark of 219.03.

Others placing in the field events were freshman Taylor Whitley in the shot put (third, 51-9), freshman Brandon Evans in the triple jump (second, 48-10), and freshman Kyle Caskey in the discus (third, 156-7).

The 15th-ranked women were once again fueled by the field events, with sophomore Esther Eisenlauer and freshman Katy Doyle taking first and third in the javelin throw with tosses of 165-

1 and 155-4, respectively.

Sophomore Meshell Trotter and Terra Taylor finished 1-2 in the hammer throw with respective marks of 177-11 and 177-11. Trotter also finished second in the shot put with a mark of 43-11 3/4, while sophomore Koonce took third with a distance of 134-11.

Koonce and senior Kelli Schnatz took second and third in the hammer throw with distances of 154-9, respectively.

Senior Detrich Clariett won the pole vault with a leap of 41-4 1/4, while freshman Jason Williams took second with a mark of 39-11 1/4.

Also placing in field events were the long jump (third, 19-1 1/4), Boren in the pole vault (third, 10-11 1/4), and man Robin Burkhardt in the high jump (third, 5-9 1/4).

In running events, the Aggies' freshman Kristy Bonn's second in the 3,000-meter run in which she placed fifth. Also placing for A&M were sophomore Na Ohaeri in the 400-meter run (1:01.58) and junior Ann Dwyer, who took 800 meters in a personal-best time of 2:44.80 to a fourth-place finish.

Both squads will resume action at the Penn Relays in Philadelphia on May 1-2.

Women ready to defend golf title

The Texas A&M Women's Golf Team will travel to Boulder, Colo., Monday defend its 1998 Big 12 Championship.
