Camp Aggieland seeks counsel

• Children's summer camp aims to pass on Aggie spirit and traditions.

Students will have the opportunity to introduce children ages 6 to 12 to Texas A&M traditions on campus through this summer's Camp Aggieland.

Camp Aggieland is a one-week day camp sponsored by the Child Movement Lab, a division of the Department of Health and Kinesiology.

Melinda Grant, director of Camp Aggieland, said the camp is in need of counselors to fulfill its two-to-12 counselor-student ratio. Students do not have to be education or kinesiology majors to apply.

"We are looking for people who enjoy being with kids, who have a good sense of humor and like to have fun," Grant said. "We are looking for students who are proud to be Aggies and want to teach others about what it is to be an Aggie."

One goal of Camp Aggieland is to teach the campers the traditions of Aggieland and to explain to them what separates A&M from other universities.

Through Camp Aggieland, camp counselors will be given the freedom to create their own lessons and activities for the campers.

Counselors' pay will be based on whether they work half days or full days.

Students are encouraged to submit applications as soon as possible, and staff will be selected by the middle of May. Applications are available in 158S Read.

The first session of Camp Aggieland will be on July 26 - July 30.

The second session will be August 2 - August 6.

Both sessions will include swimming, sports, and other activities.

Erricka Walton, Aggieland counselor and kinesiology major, said she enjoys anyone who likes to enjoy working with kids.

"It is fun working with kids and seeing how excited they learn about A&M and they are about the day," Walton said.

Walton said one of her concerns as a counselor is to be liked by all of the campers.

"Being able to connect with the kids and being able to keep them engaged is a major concern at first," Walton said. "After being a counselor, I learned how to be liked by everyone."

Qualifications for editor in chief of *The Battalion* are:

- Be a Texas A&M student in good standing with the University and enrolled in at least 6 credit hours (unless fewer credits are required to graduate) during the term of office.
- Have at least a 2.00 cumulative grade point ratio and at least a 2.00 grade point ratio for the semester immediately prior to the appointment, the semester of appointment and the semester of the appointment (all summer course work is considered summer semester) during the term of office. Order for summer school grades to qualify as previous semester grades, a minimum of 6 hours must be taken during the course of either the full or two summer sessions.
- Have completed or be registered in JOUR 301 (Mass Comm Law), or equivalent.
- Have at least one year experience in a responsible editorial position on *The Battalion* or comparable daily college newspaper, -OR- Have at least one year editorial experience on a commercial newspaper, -OR- Have completed at least 12 hours journalism, including JOUR 203 and 303 (Media Law and Ethics), and JOUR 304 (Editing for the Mass Media), or equivalent.
