Jasper County grant for trial

WASHINGTON (AP) — Jasper County officials will receive a \$284,447 Justice Department grant to help cover security costs associated with the trial of a man charged with the murder of a black man to death.

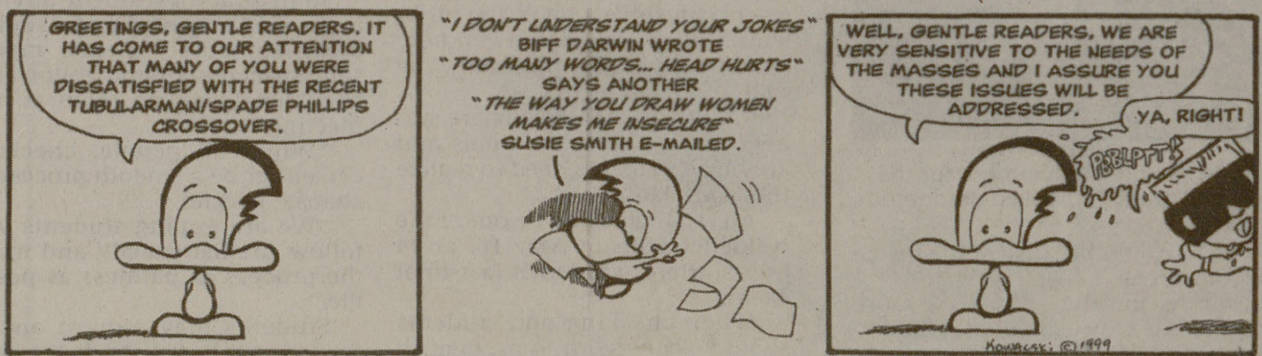
Texas Congressman Jim D-Crockett, made the announcement Thursday.

The grant will help cover costs associated with the murder of James Byrd Jr., a 35-year-old man who was dragged along a rural road for nearly three miles.

The first of three capital defendants, John Williams, 24, was convicted and sentenced to death this year for the murder of Russell Brewer, 32, in 1997. He will be tried in July and the second defendant, Shawn Allen Berry, 24, was tried in 1998.

Jasper County imposed a 1 percent property tax hike to cover the expense of these three trials but the capital murder trials expected to be heard this year. That is expected to raise \$545,000.

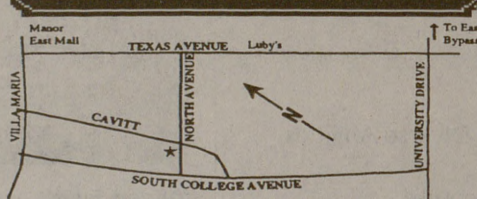
