Bush's presidential plans, big money mark 1999 sessio

AUSTIN (AP) - In their 140day Capitol stay, state legislators spent a record amount, cut taxes and watched with fellow Texans as Gov. George W. Bush emerged as a force to be reckoned with in presidential poli-

The Republican governor started 1999 by inviting lawmakers to share in his national spotlight. He ended it as the opinion poll front-runner with campaign trips to Iowa and New Hampshire beginning June

"I know there was a lot of speculation, particularly because of me," Bush said. "But by and large, the members (of the Legislature) didn't let that affect their decisions.'

In a slap at the partisan-gridlocked Congress, Bush said Texas showed the nation how lawmaking should be handled.

"People from both parties came together for a brief period of time and enacted a lot of law that will make Texas a better place," he said. "I think people, when they take an objective look, will say this has been a good session,'

On the big money issues, lawmakers took a \$6.4 billion surplus, cut \$1.85 billion in taxes and spent a record \$98.1 billion more than \$9 billion higher than the current budget.

\$1.35 billion, consumer taxes by \$277 million and business taxes by \$229 million. Bush had wanted more tax cuts — \$2.6 billion — but called these "substantial."

Critics called it too much spending, too little tax relief.

"Using the budget surplus to take us up this higher spending path means trouble for Texas taxpayers down the roz Peggy Venable, director Texas Citizens for a Soc Economy, said.

"It commits us to fund these new programs and hig salaries, yet when the econo slows down and we have budget surplus, taxpayers

get hit with a tax increase." This was only the second sion in the 20th century w Republicans controlled one the Legislature's two houses

But the GOP's one-Senate majority was enhan by the century's in Republican lieutenant go nor, Rick Perry. In the 150-House, Democratic control trimmed to 78-72.

CAPE CANAVERAL, Fla. (AP) — Working fast, astronauts fixed a broken radio, replaced flawed battery packs and installed foam mufflers over noisy fans Monday aboard the new international space station.

They launched into the repairs within minutes of entering the 77-foot orbiting complex late Sunday. Several hours later, much of the work "It literally was open the hatch and run in there

Two of space shuttle Discovery's seven astronauts immediately went to work on the radio system inside the American-made Unity modu replacing two electronic boxes. 
