The waiting game

Spurs say play will not be affected by layoffs

SAN ANTONIO (AP) — David Robinson is not worried about having more than a week off before the NBA Finals. He is getting used to these layoffs.

"We're just going to take a couple of days and get our minds right, get our bodies right and get ready to go," he said.

The San Antonio Spurs won their first trip to the championship round by sweeping the Portland Trail Blazers in the Western Conference finals with a 94-80 victory Sunday.

Now San Antonio awaits the outcome of the Eastern Conference finals, with Indiana and New York tied 2-2. The NBA Finals begin June 16 at the Alamodome.

The Spurs spent an extra night in Portland because their plane had mechanical trouble. When they arrived home Monday aboard their charter, a crowd of 3,500 fans greeted them.

"They've been part of the Spurs family for 26 years," Spurs coach Gregg Popovich said. "It's just a thrill to be able to give this to them. I couldn't be happier for them."

The Spurs came to San Antonio from Dallas as part of the ABA before the 1973-74 season. It is the only major-league sports team in town.

Usually not one for playoff hype, Popovich could not help but delight over the airport party.

"When you get all these people out here, if you don't feel that in your veins you're pretty much a dead person," he said.

Karl Malone leads All-NBA selection

NEW YORK (AP) — Karl Malone, who won the NBA's MVP award last week, today became the first player to make 11 All-NBA first teams.

Joining the Utah Jazz power forward on the first team were San Antonio's Tim Duncan, Miami's Alonzo Mourning, Philadelphia's Allen Iverson and Jason Kidd of Phoenix.

Six players had been on 10 All-NBA teams — Michael Jordan, Kareem Abdul-Jabbar, Elgin Baylor, Bob Cousy, Bob Pettit and Jerry West.

Malone received 113 first-team votes and 580 points from the 118 writers and broadcasters. Next was Duncan with 112 first-

team votes and 576 points. Mourning received 95 first-team votes and 542 points. Iverson had 93 first-team votes and 532 points, followed by Jason Kidd with 86 first-team votes and 520 points.

Voted to the second team were Chris Webber of Sacramento, Grant Hill of Detroit, Shaquille O'Neal of Los Angeles Lakers, Greg Kinnear of Seattle and Dwyane Wade of Miami.

Kevin Garnett of Minnesota, Antonio McDyess of Denver, Hakeem Olajuwon of Houston, Kobe Bryant of the Lakers and John Stockton of Utah made the third team.

practices for Monday or Tuesday. Workouts resume today.

"The gym's locked," Popovich said. "We don't want to see them on the court. We just want them to mentally and physically just restore themselves a little bit."

Rust does not seem to be a big concern for the Spurs, especially for veterans like Robinson who are glad to have some time off.

"It's played well for us so far," Robinson said, pointing out the Spurs had a few days off between each playoff series this year.

The Spurs have swept their last two rounds 4-0 and have won 10 straight playoff games.

"After the first round we had a nice little rest then we came back

pretty fresh. [We had] finished [off] after the second round. I think we'll do the same this time," Robinson said. "We're ready to go."

The time off also gives guard Avery Johnson's left knee a chance to heal. He bruised the knee late in the first half of Sunday's game after he slipped on a spot. But Johnson came back to play most of the second half.

Popovich said there is more structural wrong and the injury will ease. After arriving in Portland, Johnson sounded ready to go.

"We have to practice harder," he said. "We've still got one more goal."

Mavericks' dealings questioned

DALLAS (AP) — Did the Dallas Mavericks exceed the salary-cap by showing Gary Trent the royal treatment?

That is what the NBA is investigating, according to league spokesperson Chris Brienza.

The NBA told the Associated Press Tuesday it is investigating whether Dallas should be held liable for salary-cap violations because Don Nelson, the head coach and general manager of the Mavericks, arranged for Trent, his fiancee, their infant son, Trent's parents and his fiancee's mother to spend a week at his Maui, Hawaii vacation home last month.

The team could be fined if found guilty of the offense.

Nelson said he hoped the vacation would serve as a goodwill gesture to the 6-foot-8, 250-pound forward, whom the Mavericks are aggressively trying to re-sign after a strong 1999 season.

Trent averaged 16 points and 7.8 rebounds per game this year.

He also finished third in the balloting for the league's Most Improved Player award.

His salary this season was \$1 million.

Agassi injures thigh leaves Weber Open

HALLE, Germany (AP) — Andre Agassi has an injured thigh that forced him to withdraw on Tuesday from a Wimbledon tune-up two days after winning the French Open.

Agassi plans to return to the United States for treatment and intends to play Wimbledon, which starts June 28.

He consulted the tournament doctor at the Gerry Weber Open before dropping out because of a pulled muscle in his right thigh.

"It's a great disappointment for me," he said. "I thought two days of rest would be enough."

"I'd already felt it after the third round in Paris," he added.

"This morning I thought it was only a sore muscle but unfortunately it is not. I don't want to take any risks."

Agassi won Wimbledon in 1992, his first Grand Slam title.
