# Supreme Court axes federal ban on casino ads

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Supreme Court opened the door Monday to full broadcast advertising of casino gambling, complete with pictures of bettors at the tables. The court ruled that a federal ban aimed at protecting compulsive gamblers violates free-speech rights.

The court unanimously struck down the ban on television and radio advertising of casino gambling in states where such gambling is legal. The ban "is so pierced by exemptions and inconsistencies that the government cannot hope to exonerate it," Justice John Paul Stevens wrote for the court.

The American Gaming Association and some legal experts said the decision will allow casinos to advertise gambling even in states that ban casino gambling. The court's opinion did not say so, but it criticized the ban in broad terms.

"The presumption is that consumers are better off if left to judge the value of speech themselves, rather than to have the government judge it for them," Matthew Berry of the Institute for Justice said.

The conservative-libertarian group supported the New Orleans-area broadcasters who challenged the ban.

Stevens wrote for the court that the ban "may not be applied to advertisements of private casino gambling that are broadcast by radio or television sta-

tions located in Louisiana where such gambling is legal. More than half the states legalized casino gambling offered either by private companies or by Indian tribes.

The Clinton administration argued for the ban, had estimated the "devastating costs" caused by and estimated 3 million compulsive gamblers, and said Congress intended to address part of the problem by reining in commercial speech.

But Stevens said, "The policy of discouraging gambling, general, and casino gambling, particular, is now deemed unequivocal."

# Lott: Trade status of China secure

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Senate will go along with President Clinton's decision to extend normal trade status to China for another year, Majority Leader Trent Lott said Monday.

Lott, R-Miss., said that even if the House votes to disapprove China's trade status, it was unlikely the Senate would take up the issue.

Clinton on June 3 informed Congress that he was extending normal trade status — formerly called most-favored-nation status — to China for another year. That decision stands unless both chambers pass a motion of disapproval within 60 days after the current trade status expires on July 3.

Speaking to the National Association of Manufacturers, which supports trade ties with China, Lott said anti-China sentiments would be particularly high this year because of allegations of Chinese espionage and attempts to influence American elections, as well as the fallout from NATO's bombing of the Chinese embassy in Belgrade.

"It will be dicier because of all that's gone on in China," he told the group.

But he said that "we recognize that China is a big player in the world economy and we have to trade back and forth with them."

The extension of trade status with China has provoked an annual battle in Congress over the nation's China policy. What Congress has never succeeded in overturning a presidential decision in the 20 years since annual review began.

The administration said maintaining good trade relations at this time is particularly important as the two nations complete work on a marketing package that would open the way for China's entry into the World Trade Organization.

Those negotiations were completed this spring but were clouded by deteriorating relations and then halted by Undersecretary of State I. Pickering has traveled to Beijing to discuss the ban and try to get the WTO back on track.
