IRVING (AP) — Dallas Stars coach Ken Hitchcock is so giddy over winning the Stanley Cup that he is already talking about another championship — and another after that.
"As long as we've got one of these, why not make it two? Aw, let's go for three," Hitchcock told 20,000 fans at a pep rally Monday.
Winning two more titles is an ambitious goal for a franchise that waited an NHL-record 32 years for its first crown. The wait ended early Sunday with a six-game victory over the Buffalo Sabres.
The Stars can hope for more titles because all of their key players — Mike Modano, Brett Hull, Joe Nieuwendyk and Ed Belfour — will be back next season, and some for even longer.

Coming back for his senior year, the goal that John and the Aggies set was to make it to Omaha and the College World Series.
The Aggies realized that goal with John as the co-captain and emotional leader of a team that finished with the third-best record in A&M history.
In 70 games, John batted .363 with 10 home runs and 54 RBIs. For his performance on the year, his teammates selected him as the Marion Pugh Most Valuable Player.
When the team finished up their season in Omaha, John said it was the proudest moment in his life.
"Being a senior, it was the ideal way to go out," John said. "It was something that I will never forget. I wish that every college player got a chance to do that, but I know that I was one of the lucky ones. Even though we lost, just being up there was great."
Now that his career at A&M is over, John has begun his career with the Padres, playing with their Single-A affiliate, the Fort Wayne Wizards, while most of San Diego's draft picks go to either a rookie league or a short-season league.
Not long after arriving in Wayne Monday, he played his first professional game going 0-3 at the plate. He has not gotten off to the best of starts, John said that he is thoroughly looking forward to his professional career.
"I've only been here a couple of days, and I love it," John said. "It's nice. Our stadium is great. It's a good deal. It's some bush league thing. Most people think it's minors. The thing is that to play well. Here in minors, they don't let you do things. I have to get it done."
Even though his career at A&M is over, John is still on his way to a professional career, John said one day he will always stand out in his mind is the time he spent at Texas A&M.
"My time at A&M was the best ever," he said. "A&M was a great place to play. People around here don't know how it is there. We've got great fans. Overall, the people here treated me as well as I could want to be treated. I'm going to be happy when my degree there if I go to school there."

as the Aggies advanced to the College World Series.
"Playing with such a great group of guys, winning the Big 12 Championship, going to the College World Series, being drafted by the Cardinals ... it was an amazing year," he said.
Offensively, Schumacher had a strong season. In addition to his team-leading batting average, he also recorded 91 season hits and 11 homeruns on the season with a .425 on-base percentage.
"Batting has always been my strong point," Schumacher said.
James Schumacher agreed, remembering how at age two, his son would wait with his bat for his dad to get home from work.
"I would throw him pitches every night," James Schumacher said. "I still have that bat."
Schumacher's mother, Donna Hoffmann, also remembers her son's baseball aspirations.
"From the time he was three or four he wanted to play for the New York Yankees," Hoffmann said. "He would point at the screen and tell me he was going to play for that team."
Schumacher said he was worried about the transition to professional baseball's metal bat. He said he has practiced with the wooden bat and used them during a season two years ago.
"I feel he has the ability to be a good contact hitter," James Schumacher said. "He should make the transition to the wooden bat just fine."
Schumacher's parents said they are confident in his ability to succeed, whether in baseball or something else.
"I'm going to miss Hoffman said, "but I'm sure he will adjust well and do fine."
"He has a lot of drive to succeed," James Schumacher said. "I'm real proud of him."
Schumacher said he is moving forward to his chance to play for the Cardinals, and the possibility of being named pitcher Chieffo's mate, pitcher Chieffo who also was drafted by the Cardinals.
