San Antonio honors Spurs with parade

SAN ANTONIO (AP) — The San Antonio Spurs have their NBA title and trophy, and now they have been treated to a Fiesta-style parade and party.

Players, their families and team officials rode decorated barges along the San Antonio River yesterday as thousands of fans cheered the team's championship victory over the New York Knicks.

"This is spectacular," guard Steve Kerr told the crowd as the parade began. "Thank you so much for helping us celebrate. This is phenomenal."

City leaders who organized the parade said up to 250,000 people would be allowed along the downtown River Walk to view it. After the river ride, the players were to be featured in a fan rally at the Alamodome.

The fete was reminiscent of the Fiesta celebration that takes place in San Antonio each April and features river and street parades.

"I had no doubt they would win it," said Betty Morin, one of the fans along the river as the motorized barges inched along the concrete-lined river. "They're awesome. I just want to scream, I'm so happy."

Although admission to the event was free, some restaurants lining the banks charged up to \$50 for river-view seats.

This is the first NBA title for the Spurs, a former American Basketball Association team that

came to this city from 1973 and joined the years later.

One of the first barges carried players dating to the 1970s, including George "Iceman" James Silas and Johnny "The Iceman" Johnson.

Other barges carried musicians, Mexican folk artists and the Spurs mascot, Coyote.

Signs along the route read "Twin Tower Power," "7-footers David Robinson and Tim Duncan. Point guard Steve Kerr. Shooting guard George Ginther. Forward Larry R. Johnson and Robin Johnson. Forward Larry R. Johnson. Forward Larry R. Johnson."

Holding the trophy aloft, Robinson was congratulated by fans cheering and dancing to the James Brown song "I Feel Good."

Using a loudspeaker, Robinson told the crowd, "I thought for everything came together for year perfectly. All over the city, they've got San Antonio in their lips, baby, so enjoy it."

Duncan, on another barge, greeted by fans chanting "P! M-V-P! He acknowledge, praise by smiling and waving. Griffey leads Seattle to win over Rangers

SEATTLE (AP) — Fittingly, it was Ken Griffey Jr.'s day.

Griffey, the player most responsible for Seattle's new outdoor ballpark, was the star in the Mariners' final game in the Kingdom.

Griffey hit his 27th homer and robbed Juan Gonzalez of a three-run shot with a spectacular, over-the-fence catch as the Mariners beat the Texas Rangers 5-2 yesterday before a sellout crowd of 56,530.

"We've been watching him play like that for years," teammate Edgar Martinez said. "It just amazes me he always comes through in a situation like today. That shows the class of player he is. He's the best."

With his father, Cincinnati Reds coach Ken Griffey, watching from the broadcast booth, Griffey gave the Mariners a 3-2 lead with a three-run homer in the first inning.

"I wasn't trying to hit the ball out of the ballpark," Griffey said during a postgame ceremony on

the field. "I just got lucky."

Then, with two men left in the fourth, the nine-time Gold winner leaped over the wall in center to snare the 395-foot drive for the final out of the inning.

"It was a great play," manager Lou Piniella said. "I could tell by the way he was going back he had it timed just a matter of if he could do it."

The Mariners played 1,755th and final game in the Kingdom before moving their new home, the Safeco Field, on July 15. The play and Seattle's 1995 championship run helped support for the city's new ball stadium with a new roof.

Griffey missed Friday's game because of a sinus infection and he declined to meet reporters after yesterday's game. But his good friend, right fielder Jay Buhner, was happy to do for him.

"It was kind of a surprise," Buhner said. "It seems like it was almost like it was supposed to happen."

Reds defeat Houston

HOUSTON (AP) — A seven-game road trip against two of the best teams in the National League seems like a daunting task. Not to the best road team in baseball.

Michael Tucker homered to help the Cincinnati Reds beat the Houston Astros, 5-2, yesterday to complete a perfect road trip and nudge into first place in the NL Central.

"We're clicking on all cylinders right now," said Cincinnati's Sean Casey, who went 13-for-27 (.481) in the seven games. "Our starting pitching has been good,

we've been playing great and everybody's hitting. But Cincinnati has a big boost for the team just hoping to come in a few wins and the sweep of confidence booster."

The Reds did more than sweep a four-game series in Houston for the first time since June 1995 — the country they were in first this season — on the heels of a three-game sweep at Arizona.

The Reds lead the major league 26-10 road record, but to first they will need to improve home mark of 15-21.

"It's nice to be there, manager Jack McKeon. "We're all delighted. Think of it like to be there in October, we come back here."
