U.S. Women's Team celebrates Cup win

NEW YORK (AP) — Unaffected by a night of dining and dancing, members of the World Cup-winning U.S. women's soccer team today welcomed a few hundred fans in midtown by thanking them for their support.

"I have no idea what to say. I'm completely overwhelmed," said Brandi Chastain, who scored the game-winning penalty kick on Saturday. "We need you to be successful, so thank you very much for coming."

The U.S. Women's Soccer Team will return to the city next week for an appearance on "The Late Show with David Letterman."

The get-together marked day two of the champions' visit to New York.

The first day stretched late into the night as the women danced with their fans at The China Club. Earlier, some of them enjoyed a dinner of Chinese food.

The cuisine and nightlife choices were just coincidence and were not intended as jobs at the defeated Chinese team, insisted backup U.S. goalkeeper Saskia Webber with a slight grin.

"No, it has nothing to do with it," she said Monday night as she and a handful of teammates entered the China Grill in midtown Manhattan to a standing ovation from patrons.

After dinner, around 11 p.m., eight of the players headed to The China Club, a celebrity nightclub in midtown Manhattan.

Chastain said she and the other players worked hard to win the World Cup and needed a relaxing night of boogieing to disco tunes.

"Tonight we just want to forget about being soccer players and listen to the music," she said at the club at about 12:30 a.m.

"We had a good time just dancing," Webber said as the players' partying drew to a close about 4 a.m.

The club's disc jockey congratulated the players, who bumped hips with each other and friends on the crowded dance floor while other clubgoers applauded.

The three-week World Cup tournament ended Saturday at the Rose Bowl in Los Angeles, setting off their whirlwind of activities.

Armstrong wins third stage this year in Tour de France

SESTRIERES, Italy (AP) — Battling fierce rain and wind, Lance Armstrong looked at the steep climb and feared it might not be his day.

But then he glanced at his rivals, who were clearly tiring on the Col du Galibier mountain pass, and he summoned a burst of energy.

Armstrong, making an astonishing recovery from testicular cancer, won the ninth stage of the Tour de France on Tuesday and tightened his grip on cycling's showcase race.

In the race's first mountain stage, the Texan showed he is the man to beat. Not known as a top climber, he persevered on the punishing, rain-slicked slopes of the Alps.

China's soccer team returns home to fans

BEIJING (AP) — President Jiang Zemin led an official coming ceremony Tuesday to greet the Chinese women's soccer team, which brought home a World Cup silver medal.

The 5-4 loss to the United States on overtime proved to be a politically charged match chagrined Chinese fans.

But their sorrow has been tempered by pride that Chinese women made it to the quarterfinals and held the Americans scoreless in regular play.

"You didn't disappoint the wishes of the masses," Zemin told the team during a reception at the Great Hall of the People in the center of Beijing.

"You showed on the field the self-reliance and confidence of Chinese women."

The team returned Monday night from the United States to a raucous welcome by hundreds of fans who beat drums, crashed cymbals and sang in the Chinese national anthem outside Beijing airport.

Also at the ceremony Tuesday were Communist Party leaders Li Peng, Ruihuan, Hu Jintao and Jiang.

Many Chinese had looked on the World Cup final in Pasadena, Calif., as a great match against a rival nation whom China has a long political and trade disputes with.

Zemin said he hoped the women's soccer team would become "persistent efforts" to win other honors for the country.

The players were welcomed to Disneyland on Sunday, then overnight, landing at Newark Airport in New Jersey at 6:30 a.m. and piling on a bus to Manhattan.

"It's fun," said Mia Hamm, the U.S. team's biggest star, who loves New York. There's so many things to do and so many things to see."

The victory in the 133rd stage was Armstrong's third in the race, following the prologue and Sunday's time trial. He led the field by 6 minutes, 3 seconds.

His performance is all the more remarkable considering his cancer battle once spread to his lungs and brain. "It's unbelievable what he did doing," American great Greg LeMond, a three-time Tour winner, said yesterday. "I think he stands even better than before."

Once the rain stopped, Armstrong got stronger. He now about six miles to go, he edged away from the leading group of seven riders. Crossing the finish line, he held his aloft and looked to the sky.
