

The "primary" visits will include those suffering from fever, cough, body aches and other flu symptoms. She said the study will also look at the number of people who need "secondary" medical care, which may require another visit, for other complications such as inner-ear and middle-ear infections, bronchitis and pneumonia during the winter season.

Arden said that, if the theory is correct, Bryan-College Station will maintain around the same number of flu patients next year. These numbers will then be compared to other areas administering high levels of vaccinations in an attempt to alter the epidemiology of the disease.
